# President's Page

Our chapter elections were held on November 10<sup>th</sup>. Our board is comprised of a combination of elected and appointed positions. The following people were elected to the 7 elected positions; myself as President, Joe Billotti as Vice President, Karen Hartmann as Membership Officer, Bill Quinn as Treasurer, Roseann Barr as Secretary, Jim Coon as Sergeant at Arms, and Terry Flanagan as Legislative Officer. A subsequent board meeting was held on November 24<sup>th</sup> and the following people were appointed to the following positions; Tina Armstrong as Products Officer, Christine Sorensen as Public Relations Officer, Steve Sorensen as Road Captain, Ray Rancourt as Newsletter Editor & Webmaster, Lee Lambertson as Distribution Officer, Manna Cali as Safety Officer and Joe Marchelewski as Chaplain. I would like to congratulate and welcome the new, and returning Officers. Thank you all for volunteering to help improve our chapter!

On a less pleasant note, The New York State Board of ABATE met on November 21<sup>st</sup> and voted 8 to 2 to Impeach our State President Tim Werner aka Roadkill. The board also instituted a punishment which bars him from seeking, running or holding any office in NY ABATE regardless of its on a state or chapter level for a period of 1 year. The impeachment was uncontested but the punishment was appealed to the State Chapter Representatives. The Chapters voted to uphold the suspension. Therefore, our Vice President, Beth Gorman is now the Acting President until January 1, 2010. At the same meeting she was also elected as the next State President effective January 1, 2010.

We will have a new Regional Coordinator on January 1<sup>st</sup>. Tanya Cruz was elected to succeed me. It was my pleasure to nominate Tanya for this position! She has been doing an incredible job over the past year fighting for motorcyclists rights and working against 416A. She is in the process of establishing new chapters within the 5 boroughs and will be introducing many sport bike riders to ABATE. I am very confident that she will prove to be a valuable asset to ABATE. Welcome Tanya!

We held our annual Food and Toy Run to St Mary's church on November 8<sup>th</sup>. I couldn't believe my eyes as the bikes just kept on rolling into the Riverhead Elks that morning! We had an unbelievable 1,100 bikes that participated in the run! Besides the enormous amount of food and gifts that were donated by you, a basket was passed around for voluntary donations and you donated an additional \$3,200. to St Mary's church!! That goes to show you what you get when you combine nice weather and the generosity of the motorcycle community! We had expected a little more police assistance during the run but thanks to our members who stepped up to the plate and assisted in controlling traffic, we ended up with a safe and successful run. The Southampton Police even tracked us down at the church and thanked us for holding such an orderly and safe event. Thank you Joe Billotti for Chairing such a successful event! many pictures taken by Donna. While you're there, you can also hear the commercial that we have been airing on WRCN and B103 in order to increase awareness about L I ABATE. By the time you read this we should be airing a different commercial on WBAB also. The commercial on the website includes Suffolk County Legislator Jack Eddington stating that he supports Long Island ABATE. There are many other people that have also made the same statement which will be rotated during the airing of it. The others include The Suffolk County Sheriff, other politicians, rock musicians, and other various supporters. Thank you to each of them for proudly aligning themselves with Long Island ABATE!

Our chapter is in the process of organizing 2 social events that should be a lot of fun. The first one will be a limo bus ride in to Brooklyn to view Christmas light displays that have become very popular in certain neighborhoods. As of the writing of this article, we are planning on doing it on Sunday, December 13<sup>th</sup>. We don't have all the details worked out yet, but you can check our website or email me for updates as they develop.

The second event will be a limo bus ride to BB Kings on 42<sup>nd</sup> St in Manhattan on January 29<sup>th</sup> to see The Marshall Tucker Band. Be sure to reserve your spot early.

We are going to try something different next year for our general membership meetings. This year we held meetings on Friday nights at the Wedge in Mt Sinai every other month. But the feedback that we received from you was that you preferred to return to the second Tuesday of the month. Therefore we have scheduled all meetings next year to be on the second Tuesday of every month. However, the odd number months such as 1,3,5,7,9 &11 will remain at The Riverhead Elks Lodge. # **Chaplain's Page**

The Glory of the Ride

Riding is a way of life for some. Riding defines life to some. Riding is a drug to others, as real a drug as an antidepressant prescribed by your shrink. (And where does the term shrink come from anyway, I guess by his affect on your bank account.) To some, riding is their identity. So what exactly is it about riding a motorcycle that can make it such an instrumental part of our lives and our makeup? Is it the freedom everyone talks about? Is it the always present danger of having no protection around us as we travel at high speeds surrounded by tons of



high moving steel being maneuvered mostly by folks we wouldn't trust with our child bicycle? Can we actually put our finger on it or not? We think we know what it means but are not quite sure depending on the context it is used in.

# **Treasurer's Report**

Well the year is winding down. By the time you read this Thanksgiving will be by us and we will be looking forward to Christmas and the New Year. The St. Mary's Run was an unbelievable success. Over 1,000 motorcycles attended. You gave cash donations of \$3,200, 2 full pickup trucks of food and toys and another pile of gifts that were carried on the bikes that filled many tables at the Church. If you figure a conservative \$10 per bike, clearly over \$10,000 was raised on this run. Our chapter does not keep any of this money. All of it goes to help those less fortunate then us during the holidays. The only negative was that for the first time in the history of the St. Mary's Food and Toy Run we had to shell out \$360. in parade permits which the Chapter ate. Hopefully we can meet with the powers that be to get an exemption from these fees next year.

You can be proud of all your generosity during this year. A total of \$9,200 in checks was written from the treasury for charitable causes. We are hoping to exceed this in the coming year. At the officers meeting the other night we came up with a list of next year's runs and events. We have chairpeople for some but not all. Please consider stepping up and chairing one of the runs or volunteering to help. The old adage "many hands make light work" is so true to have a successful event. Please get involved. We need your thoughts and ideas for successful events. Next year we should be able to fund additional
