

President's Page

Are you tired of the snow yet? This is the worst winter for riding that I can remember. Hang in there, spring is on its way! Speaking of spring, its time for us to start gearing up for what we need to do to remain safe - promote motorcycle awareness! This year we are going to try something different. We are going to start a new program called Long Island ABATE's Motorcycle Awareness Campaign. We intend to make a strong push to raise funds to spend exclusively on motorcycle awareness and safety for motorcyclists. At our last general membership meeting a motion was approved to start a dedicated fund for this purpose. Another motion authorized us to loan this fund \$1,000 form ABATE's treasury as seed money to get the program off the ground. We intend to seek donations from businesses, politicians, members and the public to help us fight against distracted drivers. Our goal is to raise at least \$5,000 in order to purchase bumper stickers, lawn signs, billboards, radio ads etc. We will blitz the drivers during April, May and June with all sorts of advertising to get our message of awareness of motorcycles across to them. If we are fortunate enough to raise more funds



then we will continue it as long as the money lasts. Feel free to help us raise the funds. Ask anyone that you know if they are willing to help to raise awareness of motorcycles in order to help keep us safe. Advise them to write Motorcycle Awareness Campaign (or anything similar) in the memo field of the check. We will publish a full accounting of how the funds are spent and we will also publish the names of all that contribute to this fund. The biggest contribution to this fund is most likely going to come from the results of a new committee that has been formed for this purpose. A committee was started by Legislator Jack Eddington and Lee & Greg Sheridan of Full Throttle Magazine in order to organize a "SHARE THE ROAD RIDE". They expanded the committee to include Maude of Brickhouse Brewery, Manna Cali of On The Road Again Motorcycle School (Manna is also LI ABATE's Safety Officer) and myself as a representative of LI ABATE. The committee has decided to combine the ride with our scheduled Bike Blessing on April 11th. (I would like to publicly apologize to the Fire riding clubs that have a blessing set up the following week that we almost ended up duplicating as a result of trying to expand our event. We quickly amended our event so as not to perform a ride that closely resembled theirs. Thank you to Little John for speaking up so we were able to modify it before we finalized our plans) As a result, we have decided to start the Share The Road Ride" in conjunction with LI ABATE's Bike Blessing at the H Lee Dennison Building on Vets Highway in Hauppauge. Sign up will be from 9:00am until 12 noon. Kickstands up will be 12:30pm. There will be a safety presentation performed from 11:00am – 12:00 noon by Manna from On The Road Again and Officers from the Suffolk County Police Dept. There may also be other guest speakers. The first 150 people to register will receive a free event T shirt. The registration fee will be \$20 for riders and \$10 for passengers. Half of these fees will be deposited directly into the dedicated fund for motorcycle awareness. ABATE members will receive a \$5 discount to all fees.

Please spread the word and support this special event so that we can raise the funds needed to protect our right to be safe on the roads!

Old Business

In the future a deposit will be required for ticket reservations. Those who reserved tickets but decided not to attend cost our chapter \$300.

New Business

State Seminar: ABATE of NY hosted a state seminar January 22 – 24 in Owego, NY. Six officers from the Long Island Chapter attended for training and networking.

<u>Javits Center:</u> This year the ABATE booth was organized by Tanya Cruz, our local Regional Coordinator. Tanya is working diligently to include sport bikes in ABATE. Due to her efforts, 2 new ABATE chapters in Brooklyn and Manhattan were started in January.

Dedicated Fund for Motorcycle Safety and Awareness:

Meeting of the Minds, concerning Motorcycle Safety on Long Island

On Wed., Feb 17, Jim, Gina and I attended the meeting of the Suffolk County Traffic Safety Board. Special guests were Paul Overbaugh and Dan Montimurro of the Albany DMV. They had made a special trip to Long Island to discuss improving safety for riders here in Suffolk County. They were both very approachable; Dan is an avid rider himself, and a "real" guy, that we were very comfortable talking to.

The primary objectives are to increase awareness of motorcycles to other road users, and to make rider training more available to all levels of riders. A lot of ideas were discussed; some already in the works, and others for future consideration. They have materials being printed to disseminate to car drivers, to make them aware of motorcycles. Some will go out in the mail with registration renewals, and others will be mailed separately. In addition, other items printed with various slogans will be available to riders to remind them of safe riding tips and the value of training for all riders. Below are just a few of the ideas we brought forth at the meeting;

1. Make awareness of motorcycles a mandatory part of Driver's Education: the MSF Intersection Kit already has the hard part done for us. Making this part of the class could be as simple as distributing the kit (or just that video) to the school dis-

tricts and/or Driving Schools.

2. Emphasizing to the car-driving public that the person on the motorcycle could be someone they



know. David from Big Apple Motorcycle School had a great example of that.

- 3. Using a similar video to show on monitors in DMV offices. There we have a captive audience of drivers, usually all facing front and bored. The video could be on a loop with other safety issues as well (Drunk Driving, etc.) Even if it just showed in the bigger offices, thousands of drivers would see it.
- 4. Our member Gina also suggested that questions regarding motorcycles be added to the driver permit test. I would suggest that such a question might be in regards to the difficulty of judging the speed of an on-coming motorcycle, which is how so many of the left-turn accidents no doubt occur.

We are sure to be working with these two individuals from Albany, in concert with the SCTSB, to improve safety for all. They are listening, and they are working. Stay tuned for updates!

Tire Pressure

How often do you check the pressure in your tires? Probably not as often as you should. I know I don't. I usually leave it to my mechanic to do when I have him do maintenance on my bike. Or if I'm going on a long trip, though sometimes even then I forget. I think it is recommended to check once a week to be sure of a safe ride, but anyone who actually does that is a bit anal in my book(lol).

Now, your tires are the items that determine first of all, the comfort of your ride, secondly the safety of your ride, and thirdly how fast you can get to your destination. The funny thing is the best pressure setting to get the maximum effect of these three aspects is totally different. The most comfortable ride will be with a lower pressure setting so the tire will absorb the bumps and potholes with minimum discomfort. The problem is you will lose the traction of the tread on turns and maneuvering at a low pressure so you have to ride relatively slow to be safe.

The fastest ride possible will be at the maximum because less actual tire will be in contact with the road to cause friction and air drag. The problem is you will feel every bump and hole and pebble and the ride will be extremely uncomfortable. Also if you hit a decent size hole or bump your tire will bounce right off the road and you will have no control over your ride. So once again you will have to slow down to ride safely. Now you can add different types of suspensions (Hardtail vs. Softail) to your bike and effect the comfort of the ride but the safety



and speed issue will still be there.

So there is an optimum pressure for each tire for each bike. This will give you the most comfortable ride, with maximum speed and safety. And as long as we keep the pressure within that range we will ride with maximum efficiency.

Now as I like to say this life of ours is one big ride, it only makes sense that there is correlation to this tire pressure in our walk through this world. Pressure is, well, pressure. Or stress, or responsibilities, or problems, or anything else you want to call it. If you don't want pressure, get off the ride. That is a choice unfortunately some choose also. But we travel through this life on a load of pressure. Now some make the choice of dealing with life in maximum pressure. They are always high strung. We like to call them type A personalities. They just don't deal with life's bumps and potholes well. They get bounced off the road,

losing their tempers, jumping out at everyone and anything. Sometimes they get to where they are headed but by the time they get there they are so beat up and damaged you can't recognize them anymore. Then there is the guy who keeps a low pressure, laid back we call it. They slowly stroll through life either not allowing pressure in their life with no responsibilities or they just don't care about anything and say they have no cares. These people go through life only to look back every once in a while and notice they haven't gone anywhere and their life is pretty much meaningless. Either way both of these people these days end up trying to find the answers from a bottle or a prescription bottle.

Well God knows that pressure is good. It builds character and knowledge. And he has put responsibilities and situations in our lives to make it meaningful. Now we all go through stuff in this life, both good and bad, but the pressure that we feel throughout all our trials and challenges will shape our being. Having God in your life is like having a automatic pressure gauge and adjustment device that reads each situation that comes up and makes adjustments as you need them. If the road gets bumpy and rough he will adjust the pressure down so it will smooth out the ride through that patch of road. When the road is smooth and fast he'll crank up the pressure a bit so we don't take it for granted and go off too fast for our own good and hurt ourselves.



His purpose for us is to have the desires of our hearts (Psalms 20:4 "May he give you the desire of your heart, and make your plans succeed."), when we have a relationship with him that is. So he wants our ride to be a great one, enjoyable, productive, and safe. Every battle we have is to make sure that happens (Romans 8:28 "All things work together for the good, to those who love the Lord and are called according to his purpose".). When we come to that hairpin turn in our life it's nice to know I can lean in, hit the throttle and KNOW that my God has control of the pressure where the rubber meets the road and I will get though, no, blow through that curve with maximum comfort and speed and KNOW I am safe because he is in control of my situation, not me.

That's how I want to live my life. We call it full throttle for Jesus. It's a blast. Any questions you know where to find me.




