

## President

#### Hello everyone!

The first thing I want to do is offer my condolences to the family and friends of Bill Earley! Bill was an active member of our chapter and was also active in the PGR. Bill passed away unexpectedly on January 31<sup>st</sup>. We will miss you Bill! The next thing I want to do is thank every officer of the 2011 board as well as all the volunteers that helped throughout the year! I also want to thank all of you for allowing me the opportunity to return! I can't tell you how excited I am to be back on the board of Long Island ABATE! We have had several meetings already and we have a full year of activities planned for this year. We will do many of the traditional events but we are also going to try a few different events to see how you like them. Please don't be shy about making suggestions to us. Don't forget, it's YOUR organization. We are just trying to implement things that you might enjoy. One new idea we are trying this year is publishing a 2012 Long Island ABATE Bikers Handbook. We hope to put together a pocket size book that everyone can keep in their saddlebag that will be packed with helpful info while you are out riding. It will have helpful phone #'s, advertisements from biker friendly restaurants, bars, repair shops, professional services, politicians, etc. some ads might include coupons or discounts. It will have all of our scheduled runs, it might even have ads from other clubs listing their runs, meeting dates etc. We hope that you will find this a valuable resource throughout the year whenever you need it. We will be selling ad space until the middle of March and we will start distributing the handbooks at our April 15<sup>th</sup> Safety & Awareness Run. The ads cost \$50 per business card (3 business cards per page) or \$100. for a full page. We will print 1,000 books initially and distribute them for free. In the past, ABATE of NY would collect all of your dues money and would return \$5 per member back to our chapter. However this year they refuse to return any of your dues money and we need to make up that \$3,000 loss of revenue. We are hoping that we can accomplish this with the handbook so please help support our chapter by helping us sell some ads.

If you haven't heard, Proner & Proner has lost the lawsuit against the NYS Troopers for performing motorcycle only roadblocks. The decision does not seem to make legal sense. Mitch Proner has decided to appeal the decision to the next level (at his own expense). Instead of waiting for this issue to drag through the courts, we have decided to try another approach. You might re-

member that Suffolk County Police use to engage in motorcycle only checkpoints until our chapter appealed to the Suffolk County lawmakers and Legislator Jack Eddington as the Chairman of the Public safety committee refused to accept the grant money that was funding the roadblocks. As a result we met with police officials and lobbied them to use the same grant money for safety & awareness instead of discriminatory roadblocks. Fortunately for all of us the Suffolk police agreed to do so and the grant funding was restored. Now we are going to try this same strategy on a state level. We started by asking you to join us at a town hall meeting hosted by State Senator Flanagan. I was thrilled to see that you showed up in full force! We informed the Senator of the discriminatory tactics being performed by the NYS Troopers and asked him to meet with us to further discuss the issue. Although there were many of us in attendance, we presented ourselves in a very courteous and respectful manner and as a result I think we were effective in delivering our message. We will follow up with Senator Flanagan as well as any other opportunity's we encounter. Suffolk County Legislator Tom Muratore was present and he insisted that we meet with him so that he can try to help us with this issue. Greg from Full Throttle Magazine was also present at the meeting and he invited ABATE as a guest on their Full Throttle Rocks radio show on WRCN on Saturday night to help get the message out. Thank you FTM! So while the attorneys battle it out in court, we will try and flank them by attacking the funding source. You can go to our website to find out your state legislators and let them know your feelings on the roadblocks. Every little bit will help.

Please join us at our chapter meeting on Tuesday, February 14<sup>th</sup> in Ronkonkoma for the distribution of \$10, 000.00 worth of checks to various Veteran Organizations. These are the funds that you helped raise at the Veterans Appreciation Run last year. Bill Quinn outdid himself last year as the Chair of that event! Yes, it's Valentine 's Day so feel free to bring your spouse or date but not both!

I have so much more to discuss but Ray is pissed at me for not getting this article to him yet so you're lucky that I'm forced to shut up now. I hope you can make it Tuesday night!

### What makes a good rider?

A good level of attention

Accurate observation

· Matching the vehicle's speed and direction to the situation

 Awareness of risks inherent in particular road and traffic situations.

 Acting of their own limitations and those of the vehicle on the roads

Skillful use of controls

"A good level of attention." To me, that means devoting a high level of attention to the task at hand, which is riding defensively. It also implies having the appropriate attitude, with safety as the highest priority while you ride.

"Accurate observation." Kind of a British term, but it relates to how well you observe what is going on around you. It means more than just seeing, it also means understanding what you are seeing and the implications of what you see.

In the US, the MSF and AMA use the term "SEE, which stands for Search, Evaluate, and Execute, which are the required steps in avoiding accidents. Groups who promote safety try to condense their ideas into simple to remember acronyms or lists. These are useful, although sometimes in the act of condensing, some things tend to get left out. That's one reason to look at how the folks in the UK approach motorcycle safety.

"Matching the vehicle's speed and direction to the situation."

I like this one and consider it very valuable. Slowing down for hazardous situations is one of the most valuable techniques available to you. You need to have a keen appreciation for when you need to slow down. For example, you are following a car on a two-lane highway. As you enter a village, that car slows, apparently to turn left at a crossroads. There is an oncoming car. If you ram and jam, and power around that car ahead of you, you risk the oncoming car turning left in front of you. There will be many, many situations where you need to slow down. How good a rider you are depends on your ability to consistently determine all those situations where you need to slow down, and change lane position to maximize your visibility to other motorists. "Slow down in town" is a good motto, especially when approaching intersections with things going on.

"Awareness of risks inherent in particular road and traffic situations." This is a gem of wisdom, and one reason I saved the above list. It is not enough to scan for individual vehicles that might cause a collision. You must go beyond that, and learn to spot dangerous situations. For example, a long queue of vehicles is stopped to turn left on a boulevard in town. If you hammer past this queue at full speed, you fail to realize a dangerous situation, and are placing yourself at risk. What if there is a gap in that queue, left by a well-meaning motorist, to allow another motorist to cross that queue, say to or from a driveway? It is a dangerous situation because a gap might open up in the queue and a car come shooting out, right in your path. Scanning for that car shooting through the gap isn't enough, because it will appear too suddenly. You have to scan for the gap, and realize the dangerous situation, rather than one vehicle. This is just one example; there will be plenty of other dangerous situations out there. Elevate your scanning activities beyond recognizing vehicles that are a threat, and recognize hazardous situations.

Any time a motorist's vision is blocked you have a hazardous situation. Before you can deal with a hazard, you have to recognize it as such.

"Acting of their own limitations and those of the vehicle on the roads." I'm not a road racer, nor do I pretend to be. Excess speed is a factor in a high percentage of motorcycle accidents, especially on rural roads. Notice that there are two limitations, those of the bike, and those of the rider. I can get my bike leaned over quite a bit on a curvy mountain road and go pretty fast. But I've got touring tires mounted, not racing tires. There's a limit to how far I can push the bike. There are limits to the traction I have available.

There's also a limit to how far I am willing to push myself. Half the bike wrecks in rural areas are run-off-the-road, single-vehicle accidents. In many of these accidents, the rider fell victim to panic in a turn, and used brakes instead of counter-steering to get through the curve. In many of these situations, the rider jumped on the rear brake and skidded straight ahead and off the road in a full panic. If you know a rider who does not know what counter-steering is, then you know a rider at high risk of running off the road. Anyone who drinks and rides is limiting his own abilities to ride safely, in some cases severely enough to cause an accident. Know your own limitations. If you must drink, then one drink per hour is the sensible limit.

"Skillful use of the controls." You really do need to know how to ride a motorcycle well to be safe on one. The best idea is to learn the controls on a dirt bike or street/trail bike on a bike of modest size, rather than jump right on a full-size motorcycle. Skillful use of the controls means knowing how to get the most out of your brakes, for example. Inexperienced bikers often use only their rear brake in a panic situation, locking it up and skidding into what they were hoping to avoid hitting. This also lengthens stopping distances. You have to know that your front brake provides most of your stopping on a motorcycle.

Instead of swerving around a car partway in his lane, an unskilled rider will steer into it. You have to counter-steer to swerve a motorcycle. If you know a rider who is unaware of that, then please insist that rider get training and the know-how he needs to ride safely.

When you look over the above list of requirements for a good rider, feel free to consider all the different aspects of a good rider you can think of. I'm sure I haven't described all of them.




