

PRESIDENTS PAGE

Luckily the weather was good for Fingers' Cold Finger Run but it hasn't been too good since. Hopefully February will have drier roads than January did. But even if the ice is gone, don't forget about the sand hazard out there. It's hard enough to get motorists to look for us in nice weather, they certainly won't be 'looking' for us now so be extra careful out there.



I am still very excited for what awaits us in 2014. Our membership continues to grow and it is now above 530 members already! That is amazing! We are more than half way to our goal of 1,000 members this year so please keep up the recruiting. It is making a big difference!

We have officially joined the MRF (Motorcycle Riders Foundation) they do what we do but on a federal level. I will ask Nancy if we can get an MRF application included into our newsletter for those of you that would like to join. (See page 10 for the application) They are very active on a national level and they employee a full time lobbyist Jeff Henie who monitors and lobby's all motorcycle related legislation in Washington DC.

I have spoken with the NYSDMV representative for motorcycle safety and he said that he will provide us with a ton of free items to help us get our awareness message out there this year. He has also granted our request and had the small 4"x4" "watch for motorcycle" stickers put onto magnets for us. Previously we were buying rolls of magnets and Nancy's children were making them for us. Now we will receive plenty of them already made. He will also provide us with hundreds of lawn signs. I will be going up to Albany with a box truck to pick the stuff up shortly so that we have it for when the weather breaks.

Don't forget about our 2014 ABATE Handbook! Ads are reasonable and it will help fund our awareness campaign. We will print the handbooks and start passing them out for free at our Awareness Run in April so get your ad in soon. You can review our 2 previous handbooks on our website under publications. Like last year, it will include a run list from all of the motorcycle clubs. We have hired Sue, a Graphic Artist who can build you a custom ad for just \$25 if you don't already have an electronic ad to send to us.

I have been following many leads from our members who have been looking for a vehicle for ABATE to use for awareness. We are considering picking up a cheap vehicle that can be fitted with awareness messages and be driven to events all year long. We can set up at bike runs, street fairs, flea markets etc and give out free lawn signs, bumper stickers etc. We are considering a small school bus, box truck, step side truck, motor home etc. The most important factor is that it must be cheap! We can always upgrade as we grow, but for now we are trying to get started for a few thousand dollars. That wouldn't be possible ordinarily but thanks to the generous volunteers who have stepped up to help, we can get this done.

Those of you that were at the last meeting heard that we are trying to start a reality show about LI ABATE. Most of you thought that I was nuts and rightfully so, but if we don't try, it can't happen, so we have nothing to lose by trying. If by some miracle it does work, can you imagine what we can do for the motorcycle community on a national level? It could build the existing ABATE's as well as create new ones where none exist. It can also deliver our awareness message to motorists across the country! If you have any connections to anyone famous or who could be an asset to include into our proposal please let us know. The more interesting that we can make the idea, the better chance we have of getting a production company to take a chance on it.

Another thing we are doing and is much more definite, is that we are going to host a radio show on WRCN. Thanks to the generosity of Attorney Mitch Proner of Proner & Proner and Rich Rossi of Specialized Insurance, we will be hosting our very own 'Long Island ABATE Radio Show'. It is tentatively scheduled for Saturdays at 6:00pm on 103.9. We are hoping to be able to get our motorcycle awareness messages out to the motorists and also make motorcyclists aware of what we do. We want to make LI ABATE a household name to everyone, which will lead to more members, which will lead to more clout as an organization. Again, if you have any connections to anyone that would be an interesting guest, let us know so we can try to schedule them into a show.

Our next meeting is Tuesday, February 11th at 7:30 but free food will be ready by 7:00. As promised, I kept the meeting to a tight agenda and the meeting ended by 9:00. There were 85 people in attendance and from the feedback we received, it seems that 9:00 is a much better time to end the meeting than the 10:00 or 10:30 from previous meetings. So if the lateness of the previous meetings was an issue for you, it's safe for you to come back because our goal is 9:00. It also left time for many people to hang around and socialize afterwards and the people that wanted to get home early were able to. Keep the feedback coming because that is how we are able to customize our organization to suit your needs!

Dear Not Flat Yet,

As one of the most important and easiest things you can check for your safety and that of the passenger, ideally, it should be every day you would be taking your scoot out. Proper air pressure ensures correct handling when riding, wear on your tire, and the ability to travel with a passenger and gear with no detrimental effects. Please note air temperature will also effect tire pressure. So, just because in the summer you had the correct pressure a check of the pressure in the winter would be different. Also, low pressure could be a sign of a slow leak. Happy Riding! And keep the Rubber Side Down





Introduction of appointed positions: These appointed positions are voting members of the board. Jack Eddington (Legislative Officer), Bob Laub (Sergeant @ Arms), Roseann Barr (Recording Secretary), Nancy Gee (Public Relations Officer), Joe Pizzo (Safety Officer), Chris Lauri (Road Captain).

Introduction of additional appointed positions: These appointed positions are non-voting members of the board. Nancy Gee (Newsletter, Webmaster), Gina Otis (Products), Jim Hartmann (Distribution), Ski (Chaplain), Jackie Dalambakis (Photographer).

We continue to seek volunteers for anyone interested in assisting in any of these positions.

Minutes for the October and November membership meetings were published in the January newsletter

Motion 1-2014: Motion to accept minutes as published in the newsletter. (Seconded) All in favor.

Treasurer's Report: We now have 510 members of Long Island ABATE Inc. At \$20 per member, this gives us \$10,000 to work with. We have had initial expenses, including \$2,000 start up corporation fees, \$1,000 insurance for our events, \$2,000 advertising in **Full Throttle Magazine** for the 2014 year. *Remember, dues money remains in our treasury for any new members we get.*

Motion 2-2014: Motion to accept treasurer's report. (Seconded) All in favor.

Committee Reports

Kim / Membership: All information for our current 510 members is now in our data base. Please let Kim know if any information is incorrect or has to be updated. Approximately 250 membership packets have been mailed. Membership packets, for those who have not yet received, will be mailed soon. Please fill out ICE (in case of emergency) information on the back of membership cards. Junior membership packets are being worked on. Junior membership is free to children, of members, who are under 18 years of age. You can join or automatically renew membership on our website through paypal.

Nancy / Newsletter, Website: Please contact Nancy, e-mail address is printed in the newsletter, with any comments, suggestions, etc. about the newsletter. Look for the Junior membership pages. (This month there is a coloring contest for a carvel gift certificate.) Next month a *Dear ABATE* column will be introduced. The newsletter is being e-mailed out with a link to our website. Legislative Information: LI ABATE, Inc. as a 501C3 organization is forbidden to endorse or support political candidate or elected officials. We are permitted to lobby for or against legislation.

Joe / Safety Officer: SEX, AGE, TIME are all critical factors in accident data report released by the Suffolk County Sheriff's Office. Please contact Joe with any questions or specifics.

Chris / Road Captain: Chris is currently seeking volunteers to help with road guarding.

Gina / Products: Pictures of products will be put on our website and available for purchase.

Jim / Distribution: Jim will be purchasing acrylic carriers, which will hold membership applications, to be placed in local businesses.

New Business

Liability Insurance was purchased from **Specialized Insurance Agency**, \$1031 for a \$1,000,000 general liability policy. **Rich Rossi** gave LI ABATE, Inc. a check for \$103, which was his commission for the policy.


