

I would like to take this opportunity to express my sorrow of the passing of a truly wonderful woman who has done so much for our chapter. Nancy Fine-Dick was tragically killed in a motor vehicle accident in Florida on June 1st. Nancy was the wife of our former President Marty Dick. Roseann and I met Nancy at our first ABATE meeting 14 years ago. Michael Barba had joined about the same time and for the first few meetings Nancy would get confused on which one of us was who. But that didn't last long. We quickly got to know Nancy and we have all become very good friends ever since. For those of you who had the pleasure of getting to know Nancy, you were very fortunate. For those who hadn't had the chance. you missed the opportunity of becoming friends with a great woman! I can't help but refer to one of my favorite sayings; 'if I have to explain, you wouldn't understand.' Nancy didn't fit any traditional mold. She was very unique and she didn't have a bad word to say about anyone. She always had a smile on her face and was glad to see you despite the constant pain that she was in since her motorcycle accident about 15 years ago. She endured multiple surgeries and had electronic de-

vices implanted in her neck and back to try to alleviate the pain but no matter how much pain she was in, she treated everyone like they were the most important person in her life. Nancy not only became close with the people that she met, she also became close with their children. She had often talked with our Daughter Shannon who was about 10 when Nancy met her and Nancy would constantly ask for updates about her. Since the funeral we have spoken to many people about the loss of Nancy and it was interesting to learn that everyone else commented about how Nancy became close with their entire family also. I believe that Nancy was one of the most genuine, sincere and good hearted woman that I have ever met in my life! We will miss her tremendously! However, Nancy wouldn't want me to end my article on a serious note, so I will share my last memory of Nancy with you. As Roseann and I said good bye to her at the funeral home we couldn't help but smile as we read her shirt.

It read, 'Life's a Bitch and then you marry a Dick.'

I repeat, 'if I have to explain, you wouldn't understand.'

Treasury Report


What a day we had for the Vets Run to Montauk last month. The turnout was fantastic and the funds raised were beyond any thing anyone could imagine. The run itself raised over \$5,000. Donations after the run from people who did not attend came to \$400. Chapter donations at the last general meeting amounted to another \$130. Cyril Fitzsimmons the owner of Cyril's Fish House where we had the after party really stepped up for us. Not only did he host the after party and provide us food at his restaurant, he also cut us a check for \$1,000 as a donation to the Veterans Run. All in all the event raised \$7,000. We have gotten confirmation from our backers that they will each match this amount to give us a whopping \$21,000 to go to veterans causes. If you have any input as to any organization that is deserving of these funds please get in touch with us. Our only criteria are that they use it wisely to assist our veterans and military families that need our support. We try to focus on grass roots organizations that have little or no administrative overhead. Since the amount is a lot more then we have dealt with in the past a group of us are going to meet with Tom Ronayne the Director of Suffolk County Veterans Service Agency to get his advice on additional worthy organizations.

I personally want to thank everyone that helped out with this event. There are too many of you to render a proper thank you in this article. We could not have asked for better weather for the Veterans Run. Close to 300 participated in the event. Gold Star Mom Chris Kestler whose son 1LT Joseph Theinert lost



his life in Afghanistan only 2 years ago came out to help. I also spoke to Joseph's dad James Theinert and he told me that because of the out pouring of support from the motorcycle community for his son every time he hears a bike he thinks "that might be someone thinking about my Joey". It was truly overwhelming to see Mrs. Mary Langhorne come out to be with us at the start of the run. It was not planned. For the past several years we have invited her but church and family prevented her from attending. This year I did not call her since I felt it was a burden for her to attend and I was becoming a pest. But there she was on this beautiful day. We were able to tell the story of her son Garfield Langhorne who was given the Congressional Medal of Honor for giving up his life to save his fellow solders

while serving in the Vietnam War in 1969. It was truly special to have her with us. All she wants after over forty years of carrying the burden of losing a child is that her son Garfield not be forgotten. The only disappointment for me was not having anyone on Lance Corporal Jordan Hearter's Bridge in Sag Harbor this year. We tried and thought we had this covered but for whatever reason no one was there. Next year this oversight will be corrected. There also were some concerns about the availability of food at Cyril's. You have to keep in mind that we threw over 250 people at his restaurant in a short period of time. I apologize for this and we will work to get any of

these concerns remedied in the future.


Once again I thank all of you for coming out for the Veterans Run. We will keep you posted as to when we will be disbursing the funds.


















Meeting Minutes

The recent copy of the NYS ABATE newsletter has a picture of LI ABATE at our awareness run, along with two local politicians.


LI ABATE Handbook: Please support those who advertised and let the merchants know you saw their ad in our handbook.

Old Business

Road Signs: The 4 x 8 awareness signs which have been posted in front of each police precinct for the month of May, with the permission of **Suffolk County Executive Steve Bellone** and **Chief of Police Jim Burke**, will be coming down. The ten 4 x 5 signs posted on various county roads will remain through the month of September. The 4 x 8 sign sponsored by Brookhaven Town, which is posted on CR83 and Rt. 25, will also remain through September.

A WRCN radio commercial is being worked on. The 60 second commercial will have various motorcycle awareness statements comingled with the Marshall Tucker song "Can't You




See". Doug Gray, of the Marshall Tucker Band will also make a statement at the end of the commercial. In a 30 second PSA, a motorcycle is heard in the background, then the speaker states "You can hear us, but can you see us".

It has been an emphasis by the LI ABATE Board to meet regularly with local politicians. Last month board members met with **Assemblyman Dan Losquadro**, who is knowledgeable about ABATE, has supported us as a Suffolk County Legislator and will continue to support us as a NYS Assemblyman. The issues of motorcycle only roadblocks by the NYS Troopers and no fault insurance was discussed. *Assemblyman Losquadro was a previous insurance agent and will speak to insurance companies inquiring about the possible cost of no fault premiums*.

Jim recently met with **Congressman Bishop**, who was receptive to hearing about our concerns regarding motorcycle only roadblocks. He was asked to support H.R.7, which is federal legislation proposing billions of dollars for highway improvement. There is also language in this legislation forbidding states to use any highway funding for the purpose of motorcycle only roadblocks. It was noted that Congressman Bishop was impressed with the number of members this chapter has, again stressing the importance of building our membership. The more members we have, the louder our voice is heard.

Suffolk County Legislator Ed Romaine spoke at our opening ceremony for our Veterans Run, and presented LI ABATE with a proclamation. Legislator Romaine had a previous speaking engagement which he broke in order to attend our event. Suffolk County Legislator Schneiderman spoke at our Veterans Run ceremony in Montauk.

Our Veterans Run was a tremendous success. Thank you to all who attended and generously donated to our veterans. We raised approximately \$5800 through registrations and donations. Cyril, a proud Vietnam Veteran, of Cyril's Fish House donated an additional \$1000. Bill Quinn, our treasurer and chairperson for this event, was able to find two benefactors who would match all of the money that was raised, giving LI ABATE the ability to donate approximately \$21,000 to veteran organizations. An e-mail was read from Tom Ronayne, head of Veterans Affairs, praising 911 Veterans and USV MC for all of the work they do to help our veterans. He also thanked LI ABATE for our efforts as well.

Meeting Minutes Cont.

During the upcoming Middle Country School Board meeting, certificates of participation will be presented from LI ABATE and **Deputy Town Supervisor Kathy Walsh**, to all those students who were involved in the school art project promoting motorcycle awareness through the posters and bumper stickers they created. This project was the result of a presentation given by Wayne and Gina to high school students about motorcycle safety and awareness. Their list of high schools continues to grow, and their presentations are making a difference!

<u>Guest Speakers</u>: Suffolk County Police Department; Sergeant Lou Dini and Officer Angelo Todero. SCPD voluntarily agreed not to perform motorcycle only roadblocks with the grant money they receive from NYSGTSC. Instead, they are using this grant to promote safety and education. Their presentation included the following points:

Officers are generally looking for exhaust/loud pipes and helmet violations.

Inspection plates mounted on the left front of the motorcycle are legal.

License plates can be vertically or horizontally mounted, however must be mounted at the rear most area of the motorcycle and be readable from both sides of the bike.

Exhaust/loud pipes violations are enforced due to excessive complaints from the public. If a bike is stopped due to noise, a noise meter is <u>not</u> necessary. A bike can meet inspection law, but not comply with NYS vehicle and traffic law. The exhaust cannot be modified to amplify sound. The exhaust must have bafflers and these bafflers <u>cannot</u> be removable.

Handlebars cannot be higher than shoulder level when seated at the lowest point on the bike.






