SAFETY OFFICER

Hi! Well let me get right down to it. Now that the motorcycle show is over, there isn't much going on in the Northeast during the winter months. After doing some research into safety issues, I decided to invite Diane Ortiz of Big Apple Motorcycle School to write a little something to give you another way to handle the "winter blues".



Winter Blues by Diane Ortiz

The next few months are hard on those of us who love to ride. The cold, dark winter months, interspersed with an occasional warm day, tempt us. Our bikes sit patiently in the garage, hooked up to a low-voltage battery charger like a patient in intensive care, just waiting to get out. We've checked on it periodically to make sure it's resting comfortably, out of the elements, congratulating ourselves on treating the leather seat with conditioner before putting it away. This is a good time to check on your motorcycle leathers (jackets, pants, chaps, track suits, gloves) to see if they need any repairs or maintenance. On your list should be checking your helmets to see if they need cleaning. Stains from sweat, sunscreen and especially makeup and hair product residue can often be removed from helmet pads and liners if caught and cleaned early. Winter is also a good time to work on getting scratches off face shields/goggles/ sunglasses and inspecting helmets for damage.

For those who have the time and the means, an escape to anywhere warm where you can ride is something to look forward to. For the rest of us, getting together with friends who share our passion for motorcycling is good therapy. It helps keep the daydreams going, along with visits to the local dealers, motorcycle museums, shows and other events. Reading a motorcycle-themed book helps too. Try the newly released "Women, Motorcycles and the Road to Empowerment" by Liz Jansen, who relates experiences that instill a sense of adventure, freedom and community. You can get it on Amazon.com (ISBN 978-0-9877583-0-9). I don't have any financial interest in the book, but I did contribute one chapter which I hope will help others who are facing challenges in their personal lives. So keep those daydreams going, ride if you can and if not, enjoy some "virtual motorcycling". Either way – ride safe!

Thank you, Diane, and I would like to invite anybody else who has some insight into safety to contact me.

I ran into 2 members who asked me about some construction on Straight Path in Wyandanch near the train station. I made a few calls and found out about what was going on. The job is on schedule, but because of the type of work being done, it has made a mess and is not motorcycle friendly. This area is sought after because of Edison Ave. in an industrial park and home to many services you may need. This area can also be accessed either by Wellwood Ave. or the Southern State Pkwy. Along the same lines, this is the season for road contracts to be awarded. I'm going to try and find out who wins them, what roads will be affected, and for how long. If you see a road hazard created by construction, please call me and I will look into it.

I would like to turn your attention to your bike sitting idle over the winter, whether in your garage or storage. Pete Schappert, from Suffolk Harley gave me a great idea. Clean your bike over the winter. You'll be amazed at what you can find while wiping on some wax. Not even life threatening issues, but small things like a tire slice, bare wire, or a loose mirror that will ruin your next ride. Ten minutes in the garage can save you all day on the road. Feel free to call Pete with any of your Harley tech questions.







I attended a quarterly Chapter meeting on Saturday, February 16th in Binghamton NY. My main objective was to try to change the way that ABATE of NY conducts votes among the Chapters. My complaint is that we have 20.6% of the membership in NY, however when we vote on an issue our vote is only worth 4.76%. Below is a copy of the letter as well as a list of all chapters indicating how many members they have, and what their % of membership is compared to what their vote would be worth if they implemented my proposal. It should come as no shock to you that the idea was not embraced by them and it failed to be put to a vote due to a lack of a 2nd.

As the Representative of The Long Island Chapter of ABATE of NY Inc. I propose that ABATE of NY change its current way of counting Chapter votes from the method of 1 vote per chapter to a new 'weighted' system. Currently there are 21 chapters in good standing. That means each chapter's vote is worth 4.76% of the total vote. Under the present system, any 11 chapters (majority) can decide the vote outcome regardless of the amount of members that it represents. For example, if the 11 smallest chapters voted for something they would represent 380 members which is 16.3% of the membership. It is unfair that the current system would permit 380 members to determine the actions of an organization with 2,329 members. In order to equalize the vote more fairly, I propose that we utilize a voting system which automatically gives each chapter 1 vote plus an additional vote for every 50 members it has as of De-

motorcycle related news from AROUND THE NATION

PICKERINGTON, Ohio -- The American Motorcyclist Association expressed concern to a U.S. House subcommittee about possible damage to motorcycle and allterrain vehicle engines caused by the inadvertent use of E15 when the new fuel becomes widely available. In testimony to the House Subcommittee on the Environment during a hearing on "Mid-Level Ethanol Blends: Consumer and Technical Research Needs" on Feb. 26, Wayne Allard, AMA vice president for government relations, said that motorcycles and ATVs should be part of any scientific study into the effects of E15 on engines to ensure that the new fuel blend won't damage those engines.


He also cautioned that E15 could lower fuel efficiency and possibly cause premature engine failure for motorcycles and ATVs.

E15 is a new fuel blend of 15 percent ethanol and 85 percent gasoline that the EPA has approved for use in 2001-and-newer passenger vehicles. The blend isn't approved for use in motorcycles, all-terrain vehicles, boats, lawn mowers and other engines, and may even damage them and void warranties.


E10, which is commonly found at gas stations, contains 10 percent ethanol. E0 fuel has no ethanol. Ethanol is grain alcohol produced from crops such as corn that is mixed with gasoline to produce an ethanol-gasoline blend motor fuel.

cember 31st of the preceding year. (in order to keep it simple for the entire calendar year) For example; a chapter with 6 members would have 1 vote. A chapter with 50 members would have 2 votes, 100 members would be 3 votes etc. Attached is a chart which shows how it would affect each chapter.
