New Business

Motorcycle Only Checkpoint: A motorcycle only checkpoint was set up on the LIE eastbound, between exits 65-66, at 11am on November 6, the day of our St. Mary's Food and Toy Run. Suffolk County Police Dept., NYS Troopers, and the MTA were involved in this checkpoint. Previously Jim had met with Suffolk County Legislator, Kate Browning, chair of the Suffolk County Public Safety Committee, Police Commissioner, Tim Sini, and Chief of Department Cameron, to discuss the matter of motorcycle only checkpoints. It was agreed that the conversation would continue, however Jim has not heard anything afterward. Double D, Prospector, member of NCOM, and Meagan, from the MRF, are now involved in this ongoing fight. A FOIA request has been made, and Jim along with other motorcyclists, will again speak before the Suffolk County Legislature. Jim asks members to call Suffolk County Executive Steve Bellone's office at (631) 853-4000 to register a complaint about the discriminatory practice of motorcycle only checkpoints, and ask that an end be put to this practice.
