

Suffolk County Legislator Rudy Saunderman, **3**rd **legislative district**, praised LIABATE for educating the public about motorcycle safety and awareness, as well as encouraging the training of motorcyclists. As a former firefighter, fire chief, first responder and teacher at the Suffolk County Fire Academy, Legislator Saunderman appreciates the importance of what we do. He went on to address quality of life issues he wants to address as a legislator, including treatment and education of drug abuse and vacant houses. He responded to questions from the membership.

There was no membership meeting in December. The minutes for our last membership meeting, November 2017, were published in the January 2018 newsletter.

Motion 1-2018: Motion to accept November 2017 membership meeting minutes as published in the January 2018 newsletter. (Seconded) All in favor.

Treasurer's Report: Jim gave treasurer's report in Bill's absence. A voluntary donation jug to begin collecting for our 2018 Veterans fund was passed around. Bill, again, was able to secure three benefactors who will match all funds raised. Thank you to all who donated.

Motion 2-2018: Motion to accept treasury report. (Seconded) All in favor.

Committee Reports

George / Membership: George reported 1,973 members on the books. 5 new members were signed up at tonight's meeting.

Memberships can be renewed by mail, online or at a membership meeting. Memberships can be renewed at any time. Your current membership will be extended for one year. *It is imperative that members renew and that we keep our membership numbers up. It is the only way we can be effective when we meet with public officials in protecting the rights and safety of motorcyclists.* If you are not receiving LI ABATE newsletters or e-mails, please let George or Nancy know and the e-mail data base will be updated.

Nancy /2nd Vice-President / Website: Nancy continues to update the website. A *Google* calendar has been installed. Members can click on a date on the calendar and a list of events will come up for that date. Newsletter: Anyone wishing to advertise in our monthly newsletter, please contact Nancy.

Mike / Legislative Officer: Legislation that Mike will be focusing on this year include motorcycle profiling and revised exhaust pipe legislation. **Safety Officer:** Mike will work with Suffolk County Legislator Saunderman regarding road conditions. If anyone knows of a dangerous pothole, please let Mike know of the location. Mike reminds motorcyclists to check tire pressure before riding during the cold winter months. Mike cautions riders about slick roads.

Andrea /Public Relations: Andrea is excited about taking on public relations. She will be highlighting LI ABATE throughout the years, beginning with it's inception as a chapter of ABATE of NY. Volunteer Coordinator: Andrea will be collecting e-mail addresses and phone numbers for volunteers who wish to assist, in any capacity, on upcoming runs, events, booths, etc. Please see Andrea if you are willing to volunteer. Your help is always appreciated.

Joe / Road Captain: Joe is asking for volunteers for our upcoming runs / events. If anyone is interested in assisting with road guarding, parking/lining up bikes before a run, etc., please see Joe.

Guest Speakers

Caldwell Banker Realtors Scott, a representative from the national office and local broker **Ron Starrantino,** spoke about the *Real Estate Advantage Program*, a nationwide program through Caldwell Banker Real Estate offered to LI ABATE members. Through this program, LI ABATE members will receive cash back when buying or selling property through a Caldwell Banker real estate agent. LI ABATE members will be linked with agent Ron Starrantino, a motorcycle enthusiast and LIABATE member. He will give back 20% of his commission at the conclusion of

a property purchase or sale. Ron also encourages members to call for a free, no obligation home appraisal.

Margaret, Mama Dukes, works for Motorcycle Mike Esq. She explained how they conduct monthly focus groups, or mock trials, where "jurors" will listen to the attorney's case, then be questiond by the attorney for feedback. "Jurors" will be compensated \$60 for 2 ½ hours of their time. A focus group will be held Wednesday, Jan. 17, then will occur monthly. If anyone is interested, please contact Mama Dukes for further information or to fill out a survey.

Old Business

LI ABATE 2018 Motorcyclist Handbook: Nancy will begin working on the 2018 Motorcyclist Handbook. If anyone is interested in advertising, please let Nancy know. Advertising prices remain the same as last year, \$100 for a full-page ad and \$50 for a half-page ad. (If advertising art is needed, an additional \$25 fee will be imposed.)

NYS Governor's Traffic Safety Committee Grant: LI ABATE was awarded \$29,400 for the year 2018, for educational and awareness materials to spread the motorcycle awareness message to the public sector. **Debbie Stondell** volunteered to help administer this grant.

NY Motorcycle Show at the Jacob Javits Center was held December 1-3. Jim thanked all who volunteered at our booth. LI ABATE paid for a 10x20 booth, which was reimbursed by **AIM Attorney, Mitch Proner.** ABATE of NY and CMRA were also invited to participate at this booth.

LI ABATE participated in a chili cook-off at Spirit's Promise Horse Rescue on November 18. We did not place in the top four. All proceeds benefitted our Veterans.

WACO update: The first of the defendants, Jake Carrizal, Dallas President of Bandidos MC, went on trial. The evidence presented did not prove that Jake committed a crime, resulting in a hung jury. Most jurists polled did not feel he was guilty. A new trial date has been set for April. A second defendant was offered a one year deferred probation for pleading guilty to a misdemeanor charge. He otherwise faces a 25 to life sentence if convicted. The defendant declined the offer, determined to prove his innocence. Convictions in these cases will have ripple effects for motorcyclists throughout the country.

New Business

LI ABATE meeting location: Suffolk County membership meetings will continue at the current Ronkonkoma FD location. The Ronkonkoma FD has been charging LI ABATE \$50 per meeting to use this hall. At a recent FD board meeting, it was decided to raise meeting fees for all organizations to \$150 per meeting. This fee was deferred for LI ABATE until July 2018. **Organizational Meeting** for all the motorcycle clubs on Long Island will take place on January 13th. The purpose of this meeting is to discuss runs and events for 2018. Representatives from LI ABATE will attend this meeting.

Oyster Bay Supervisor Joe Saladino and Jim met backstage at a *Marshall Tucker* concert. Jim spoke about LI ABATE. Supervisor Saladino expressed interest and agreed to post motorcycle awareness signs along town roadways.

ABATE of NY treasurer was asked to resign. He refused. Impeachment proceedings are underway for alleged misuse of funds.



What is the Motorcycle Profiling Project?

What is the Motorcycle Profiling Project?

The Motorcycle Profiling Project (MPP) is dedicated to the grassroots effort to pass laws addressing profiling and discrimination. The MPP is not intended to replace other organizations. Rather, the project is intended to coordinate and unify the different elements and organizations in each state towards this common goal, including the Confederations and Coalitions of Clubs, US Defenders, C.O.I.R., ABATE, MMA, NCOM, MRF, AMA and the many smaller MRO's that exist around the country.

Who created the Motorcycle Profiling Project?

David "Double D" Devereaux, a motorcycle rights activist from Washington State, and a leading advocate for laws addressing the issue of motorcycle profiling in America. Double D spearheaded the effort in Washington as spokesperson for the movement. Double D represents the Washington State COC and US Defenders, NCOM Legislative Task Force, US Defenders National Office, BOLT, and he is a member or supporter of ABATE, the MRF, and the AMA. Also offering assistance to the project are Jeff "Twitch" Burns (activist, public records, media expert and documentary filmmaker), Bill "Colt" Kaitz (activist that leads the Maryland US Defenders), Donnie "Mr. Breeze" Landsman (activist, independent advocate and legislative expert), along with many others.

This unified effort resulted in the first law addressing motorcycle profiling in America. Importantly, Washington's law passed through the legislature unanimously and the same legislation is receiving support in many other states. The Maryland COC/US Defenders and ABATE, working with the Project, unanimously passed profiling legislation through their Senate in 2015 and seems likely to pass the law through both chambers in 2016.

Services

What services do the Motorcycle Profiling Project provide? The Motorcycle Profiling Project is designed to help your state with every step involved in the process of passing a law addressing the issue of motorcycle profiling. Based on the experiences and best practices of the highly effective motorcycle rights movement in Washington State, the Project will assist in organizing and preparing your state to take effective grassroots action. The project provides organizational recommendations, policy support materials, and legislative strategy. This includes, but is not limited to:


- Organizational strategy.
- Coordinating COC's and MRO's in a unified effort.
- Step-by-step Action Plan outlining the entire process, beginning to end.
- Construct a state-specific Pattern of Evidence.
- Drafting a Policy Report/Written Testimony. This is the state's official statement on legislation addressing the issue of motorcycle profiling.
- Drafting a Legislative Proposal and Legislative Packet
- Drafting a Request for Sponsorship
- Drafting CTA's and correspondence to legislators.
- Drafting testimony and providing testimony upon request, schedule permitting.
- Media support and press releases.

What do the Motorcycle Profiling Project's services cost? The Motorcycle Profiling Project offers all of its services to the motorcycling community FREE of charge. If an individual or organization sees value in the project, then contributions are highly appreciated. The project relies on these contributions as the sole means of covering expenses and compensation for work performed. SAFETY & LEGISLATION

- Long Island ABATE was present at Januarys Highway safety meeting. We educated the traffic safety board that even in January when the temperatures are in the twenties, we still have motorcyclists on the road. We expressed our concerns with the conditions of the roads and the hazards it presents to us.
- Pot holes have been filled on portions of the Long Island Expressway. I have seen Brookhaven Town out with their crews filling potholes.
- Harley-Davidson is recalling 175,000 motorcycles because the brakes *might fail*. The U.S. recall covers more than 30 models from the 2008 through 2011 model years. Harley says deposits can form on brake parts <u>if</u> <u>the fluid isn't changed every two years as specified in the owner's manual</u>. That can cause a valve in the antilock brake control unit to stick.
- The U.S. government's National Highway Traffic Safety Administration began investigating problems in July of 2016 after getting 43 complaints including three reports of crashes and two injuries. (Thanks Jim for the update.)
- One accomplishment Long Island ABATE has on the legislative side is, New York State has added two motorcycle related questions on the written exam pool for 2018.
- In the third week of February LIABATE will be making appointments with our representatives for the Bikers Inside the Beltway located in Washington D.C. on Monday May 14th and Tuesday the 15th. 2018. Feel free to ride down and meet your representatives.
- Something to be aware of is PARKING your scoot. In Our Towns, Hamlets, Villages on Long Island. Be aware of where you are parking and the regulations for that parking lot. We have to know if the facility wants us to share a spot with motorcycles or not. Know if there is a time limit or free parking available. According to an article in Newsday Bay Shore has claimed they reaped over \$900,000 in parking fees. Parking violations netted over \$130,000. The Town of Oyster Bay is looking into increasing their parking fees. This could impact parking in Massapequa.

We oppose Assembly Bill 03033


SAME AS Senate Bill 03528
