August 2018 Minutes

Long Island ABATE 8-14-18 Membership Meeting, Ronkonkoma, NY BBQ before the meeting. Thank you *Marco for doing the cooking.* 7:38 Meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance. Welcome new members and guests.

The minutes for our July 2018 membership meeting were published in the August 2018 newsletter and on the LI ABATE website.

Motion 18-2018: Motion to accept July 2018 minutes as published in the August 2018 newsletter and posted on the LI ABATE website. (Seconded) All in favor.

Treasurer's Report: Detailed income and expenditures were reported

Motion 19-2018: Motion to accept treasury report. (Seconded) All in favor.

Committee Reports

George / Membership: To date, there are 2,045 members on the books. Membership year pins are available at membership meetings and LI ABATE booths. George is focusing on getting expired members to renew. Memberships can be renewed by mail, online or at a membership meeting. Memberships can be renewed at any time. Your current membership will be extended for one year. *It is imperative that members renew and that we keep our membership numbers up. It is the only way we can be effective when we meet with public officials in protecting the rights and safety of motorcyclists.*

Nancy / Vice President / Website: Campout tickets are available at membership meetings, LI ABATE booths and on the LI ABATE website. Advance tickets are \$30, \$40 the day of the campout. **Newsletter:** Motorcycle event flyers will be included in our newsletter for one month free of charge. Please let Nancy know. Nancy also encourages members to send in stories, classified ads, etc., for publication in our newsletter.

Kathy / Products: New t-shirts, hats, etc. will be available at the campout.

Old Business

Veterans Appreciation Run: Donations continue to come in for the 2018 Veterans Appreciation Fund. To date LI ABATE has raised over \$125,000. A special thank you to **Steve** from **On The Road Again Motorcycle School** for his generous donation of \$1325 given at tonight's meeting. All donations will be quadrupled. Thank you to Nancy for submitting an article about this run to *Full Throttle Magazine.* **NYS Governor's Traffic Safety Committee Grant:** LI ABATE was awarded \$29,400 for the year 2018, for educational and awareness materials to spread the motorcycle awareness message to the public sector. We will submit a proposal to fund the printing of a children's booklet that **Karen Worth** has been working on to encourage children to look for motorcycles while riding in the car.

First Amendment violation: There is a new vendor at Cedar Beach in the Town of Babylon, who had a "no colors" sign posted outside his establishment. It is a First Amendment right for colors to be worn, and government entities are not permitted to discriminate. Since Cedar Beach is a Suffolk County beach, the vendor must follow this law, as the establishment is government property. Jim contacted **Double D**, who wrote and sent a letter to the Town of Babylon and to the new vendor expressing this First Amendment discrimination. Both responded cordially and forwarded the letter to the Babylon Town Attorney. Double D was asked to provide case law, and immediately submitted five case laws. LI ABATE will continue to follow up on this matter.

WACO Update: Of the initial 150+ indictments, all but 25 cases have been dismissed. Of these 25 cases, 22 have been indicted on rioting charges. These cases are now being appealed.

New Business

LI ABATE Truck: LI ABATE purchased a 1997 Ford F350 box truck for \$2500. Chris and Mike worked on the truck, and it is now running well. The box is water tight and truck has a built in ramp, which will be able to tow bikes that break down during runs. The truck will hold booth supplies and products. The box will be a traveling billboard.

Sponsorship for **Your Island Live** with **Tom Schiliro**, (which airs on 103.9 Monday through Friday, 12:00 – 2:00) was renewed. Tom asked Jim to speak with him live on the show every other Wednesday through November.

Court Cases: LI ABATE members **Chris and Rose Pesce** were hit by Desri Medlock on July 8th. Both are now at home, and thank all for their support. Medlock was allegedly high on PCP and fled the scene. The driver was held on \$20K cash or \$45K bond. He has since made bail. Misdemeanor charges will be upgraded to felony charges. The next court date will be 9/13 in Central Islip. In the case of **Rich Schmansky**, who was killed in a motorcycle accident, the driver was scheduled for an administrative hearing through the Department of Motor Vehicles. The driver did not show up. (The Department of Motor Vehicles holds administrative hearings for drivers who were involved in serious accidents. At the time of the hearing, the driver's license may be suspended or revoked.) LI ABATE is advocating that the DA's office reopen and reinvestigate this case, as there are many unanswered questions. Suffolk County Sheriff Errol Toulon spoke at our Veterans Appreciation Run. *Thank you Bill Forrester* for introducing him to LI ABATE. Sheriff Toulon said he would make a PSA for motorcycles, specifically targeting the dangers of a driver turning left in front of a motorcycle. Sheriff Toulon was true to his word. The PSA aired on 103.9 and is also on the Suffolk County Sheriff website under *conversation card / motorcycle safety*.

Nordic Lodge Ride: We will be taking a ride to the Nordic Lodge on 8/26. Whoever is interested in going, we will be meeting at the Port Jefferson ferry at 10:15.

SAFETY & LEGISLATION

New York's Move Over Law Has Changed

Effective January 1, 2012

Protects law enforcement officers, emergency workers, tow and service vehicle operators and other maintenance workers stopped along roadways while performing their duties.

- Drivers **must** use due care when approaching an emergency vehicle that displays red and/or white emergency lighting:
 - On all roads and highways, drivers **must** reduce speed;
- On Parkways and other controlled access highways with multiple lanes, when approaching an emergency vehicle that displays red and/or white emergency lighting or a hazard vehicle displaying flashing amber lighting, drivers **must** move from the lane immediately adjacent to the emergency or hazard vehicle, **unless** traffic or other hazards exist to prevent doing so safely.

Penalties:

• Violations of this law are punishable as a moving violation.

A reminder to pull over for disabled vehicles and emergency vehicles. At the Suffolk County safety meeting in June, SCPD said they will be enforcing the law to pull over or slow down when there is a disabled or emergency vehicle on the shoulder. We hear all too often of police officers that are injured or killed while assisting people on the roadways.

SAFETY

Suffolk County Police Fifth Squad detectives are investigating a crash that killed a motorcyclist in Holbrook shortly after midnight.

A motorcyclist was operating a 1995 Harley Davidson motorcycle southbound on Veterans Memorial Highway, near the Sunrise Highway overpass, when the motorcycle left the roadway and struck a metal barricade. The Motorcyclist was pronounced dead at the scene by a physician assistant from the Office of the Suffolk County Medical Examiner.

The motorcycle was impounded for a safety check.

Please don't let this be you. Check your motorcycle often. At the very least tire pressure.

If you haven't gone for a motorcycle lesson you are putting yourself at risk.

Just because you have been riding for thirty years doesn't mean you haven't been making the same mistakes for thirty years. Maybe you have just been lucky. Hopefully you have skill.

What is the Motorcycle Profiling Project?

What is the Motorcycle Profiling Project?

The Motorcycle Profiling Project (MPP) is dedicated to the grassroots effort to pass laws addressing profiling and discrimination. The MPP is not intended to replace other organizations. Rather, the project is intended to coordinate and unify the different elements and organizations in each state towards this common goal, including the Confederations and Coalitions of Clubs, US Defenders, C.O.I.R., ABATE, MMA, NCOM, MRF, AMA and the many smaller MRO's that exist around the country.

Who created the Motorcycle Profiling Project?

David "Double D" Devereaux, a motorcycle rights activist from Washington State, and a leading advocate for laws addressing the issue of motorcycle profiling in America. Double D spearheaded the effort in Washington as spokesperson for the movement. Double D represents the Washington State COC and US Defenders, NCOM Legislative Task Force, US Defenders National Office, BOLT, and he is a member or supporter of ABATE, the MRF, and the AMA. Also offering assistance to the project are Jeff "Twitch" Burns (activist, public records, media expert and documentary filmmaker), Bill "Colt" Kaitz (activist that leads the Maryland US Defenders), Donnie "Mr. Breeze" Landsman (activist, independent advocate and legislative expert), along with many others.

This unified effort resulted in the first law addressing motorcycle profiling in America. Importantly, Washington's law passed through the legislature unanimously and the same legislation is receiving support in many other states. The Maryland COC/US Defenders and ABATE, working with the Project, unanimously passed profiling legislation through their Senate in 2015 and seems likely to pass the law through both chambers in 2016.

Services

What services do the Motorcycle Profiling Project provide? The Motorcycle Profiling Project is designed to help your state with every step involved in the process of passing a law addressing the issue of motorcycle profiling. Based on the experiences and best practices of the highly effective motorcycle rights movement in Washington State, the Project will assist in organizing and preparing your state to take effective grassroots action. The project provides organizational recommendations, policy support materials, and legislative strategy. This includes, but is not limited to:

- Organizational strategy.
- Coordinating COC's and MRO's in a unified effort.
- Step-by-step Action Plan outlining the entire process, beginning to end.
- Construct a state-specific Pattern of Evidence.
- Drafting a Policy Report/Written Testimony. This is the state's official statement on legislation addressing the issue of motorcycle profiling.
- Drafting a Legislative Proposal and Legislative Packet
- Drafting a Request for Sponsorship
- Drafting CTA's and correspondence to legislators.
- Drafting testimony and providing testimony upon request, schedule permitting.
- Media support and press releases.

What do the Motorcycle Profiling Project's services cost? The Motorcycle Profiling Project offers all of its services to the motorcycling community FREE of charge.
