What if I have a bike currently in winter storage?

We will continue to keep all winter storage bikes in storage and they will be available for pickup in the spring.

Are Gift Cards & Pre-Paid Maintenance still valid?

Where can we receive ongoing Service/Warranty work on H-D motorcycles?

Motorcycle Museums Across America

1. Barber Motorsports Museum

The Barber collection includes more than 1,400 restored motorcycles and cars; over 600 bikes are on display in the museum. Established to preserve motorcycle history, the collection represents 216 different manufacturers from 20 countries. Barber is generally acknowledged as the preeminent motorcycle museum in the U.S. 6030 Barber Motorsports Parkway, Birmingham, AL, (205) 699-7275, <u>www.barbermuseum.org</u>.

2. Wheels Through Time

Located five miles off the Blue Ridge Parkway, the Wheels through Time Motorcycle Museum collection showcases rare, vintage American motorcycles and memorabilia. The 300 historic American motorcycles span numerous genres, including board track racers, hill climbers, military bikes and more. 3. Harley-Davidson Museum

The main exhibit areas focus on aspects of Harley-Davidson history and culture. For example, Clubs & Competition explore board track racing and hill climbing competition. The Engine Room has an interactive wall that features the company's various engine designs. 4. Motorcyclepedia Museum

The goal of this museum, with its collection of over 450 bikes and memorabilia is to educate the public about the history, culture, and changing technology of motorcycles. 5. AMA Motorcycle Hall of Fame Museum

The AMA's Motorcycle Hall of Fame Gallery celebrates individuals who have promoted the sport on tracks, roads, trails, and in the halls of government. 6. Solvang Vintage Motorcycle Museum

This extensive private collection of vintage motorcycles emphasizes racing machines. Marques in the collection include AJS, BMW, Ducati, Gilera, Matchless, Moto Guzzi, Velocette, Vincent and others, which range from 1910 to the present. 7. Lone Star Motorcycle Museum

Located in the Texas Hill Country, the Lone Star Motorcycle Museum is also a limited menu eatery with its tables spread among the collection of motorcycles. 8. National Motorcycle Museum

This privately owned, non-profit museum has over 450 bikes on display, many of which are on loan from private collectors. Current staged exhibits include a barn find, a completely restored 1920's Shell Gas Station, and several antique motorcycles. 9. The Rocky Mountain Motorcycle Museum and Hall of Fame

The museum's primary focus is on pioneers in the historic development of American two-wheeled transportation. Spinning Wheels — Empire State Motorcycle Safety Education Program

When it comes to riding, one of the most important physical properties we may sometimes take for granted is traction. Although our tires come in various sizes and tread patterns, the contact patch area that gives us traction to move, turn, and stop is about equal to the size of our palms - certainly doesn't seem like much does it?

With a recent move from a rural setting to a busy suburban location and a commute to New York City on a daily basis, I've become more aware of spots where traction can be lost, which could result in an unwanted scenario. Granted, a lot of these points are also found in a rural setting, but in a congested area they are more prevalent. So, if you've become a bit complacent about some of these spots for traction loss, or never considered them, maybe this will work as a wake-up reminder, hopefully before you encounter them in t he wrong way.

Manhole covers and drainage grates seem to be a staple of road and highway construction, and are certainly in abundance within crowded areas. These pieces are normally made of solid steel, and though some manhole covers may have a traction pattern incorporated in their casting, it doesn't help much. These large sections of ore can quickly reduce the grip of your tires. When you add other elements such as rain and fluids from other vehicles (oils, antifreeze. etc.), manhole covers can simulate the slickness of an ice skating rink.

Tollbooths are another location where the buildup of slippery snot can ruin your day. With traffic being slow and heavy in these spots, the increase of traction-reducing elements can make things challenging. Most are covered with a canopy that makes it hard for rain to wash away the slime, which means you've got a location where the chance of spinning your wheels can easily lead to you getting a closer look at the crap. Another hazard to keep in mind with toll booths: if you're not using an electronic payment device and stop to pay your toll, you're probably close to the booth itself. With motorcycles being narrow in profile and stopped in a spot that may not be well lit, it's easy for a driver not to see you. So besides using caution for road conditions, also remember to keep an eye on your rearview mirrors.

Painted crosswalks, railroad crossings and other road "art" are other easily overlooked spots for us to slip and slide. These painted places on the roadway are typically large swatches of paint and sometimes the Department of Transportation uses a peel and stick method in lieu of paint; which is just as slick. When you see those infamous grip stealers, remember to use caution when crossing them. Some safety presenters even recommend that you address them in a similar fashion to passing through an area of water: just before you cross the point, squeeze in your clutch to eliminate the chance of a "power" spin and losing that valuable traction. If there is no power being transferred to the rear wheel, you lessen the chance of dealing with an undesirable condition. Keep in mind, when you see railroad crossing signs painted in the roadways, shortly after them will be a set of steel rails that are smooth and polished from wear that you will have to cross over. Whenever possible, consider approaching them at a 90-degree angle to reduce the risk.

As with the tollbooths mentioned before, other covered areas should raise a flag of caution. While we may just enter a gas station for more of the precious fluid that will keep us rolling, we could be entering a playground for spinning wheels. Keep in mind that gasoline or diesel is a petroleum product and is slippery. People at times accidently overfill their gas tanks and spill fuel on the pavement, vehicles sit there dripping greasy stuff while they're fueling, and the fact that all this takes place under a covered surface might just turn that oasis of motor juice into a nightmare.

There are tons of risky items that are related to riding motorcycles; some we can control, some not. It only takes a moment for things to become bad, yet it also only takes a moment to consider the risks we encounter and plan for them accordingly. There are enough circumstances out there that can make our ride have a negative outcome; besides it being easily avoided, telling someone you wiped out in one of these spots could also be a bit embarrassing. So, to continue enjoying your rides without problems that can have damaging results, keep the simple things in mind as well. Don't become complacent, use something that can easily be part of your defense when riding - common sense

They envisioned a team committed to core values like respect for riders' diverse lifestyles and opinions, integrity in conduct, excellence and boldness in facing challenges head-on and, above all, leadership – leadership in the unrelenting struggle for the safety and freedom of American motorcyclists.

So, at a meeting of the minds of grassroots leaders, a new leader was born: The Motorcycle Riders Foundation. The first motorcyclists' rights advocacy organization with a full-time legislative and political presence in our nation's capital. The only Washington voice devoted exclusively to you, the street rider. And each year, the leaders of the now-worldwide community gather for motorcycling's premier political lead-ership summit — named to commemorate the gathering at which we were founded: The MRF Meeting of the Minds.

Throughout the USA and across the world, the torch of freedom burns in the hearts of motorcyclists. One by one, they recognize the need to become volunteers as co-partners in an organization committed to integrity, respect, leadership, teamwork and excellence.

To operate a motorcycle in New York State, you must have a motorcycle operator's license (Class M) or a motorcycle junior operator's license (Class MJ). You can drive a motorcycle in New York if you are a resident of another state or country and have a valid motorcycle license from there. If you are less than 18, you must obey the restrictions for both the out-of-state jurisdiction and New York State. The instructions to apply for a driver license, which includes a motorcycle license, are in Chapter One of the NYS Driver's Manual. You can study that manual as well as this one, even if you already have a license. Your motorcycle license written test will be based on information from both manuals. The Driver's Manual also contains the junior operator and learner permit restrictions, information on license suspension and revocation and vehicle registration, title and insurance. The Driver's Manual describes the junior operator and learner permit restrictions, information about license suspension and revocation, and vehicle registration, title and insurance. Junior motorcycle operators are also subject to the New York State graduated license requirements that apply to other drivers. In addition to the information in the Driver's Manual, motorcycle operators must know that:

When a motorcycle learner practices the supervising driver must hold a valid motorcycle license, be at least 21 and remain within 1/4 mile of the learner at all times. Additional restrictions apply to junior learners. The supervising driver need not ride on the motorcycle of the learner, but only the supervising driver can be a passenger. The learner and supervising driver should remain within sight of one another at all times and discuss the learner's performance after prac-tice. We recommend at least 30 hours of practice, with at least 10 in moderate to heavy traffic.

Your road test will include left and right circles and figure-eights on public streets. In addition to normal driving maneuvers, you must be able to accomplish these while being alert for other traffic. If you take the test on a threewheeler, your motorcycle license will be restricted to driving three-wheelers.

You must provide road test transportation for the license examiner in a properly registered and inspected car or truck, and a driver at least 21 years old who is licensed to drive both this vehicle and the motorcycle you will drive during the test.

If you have a driver license, your current class and motorcycle class will both be listed on one license document (for example, Class DM).

If you already have another class of driver license and a motorcycle operator's learner permit, the DMV will waive your motorcycle road test if you complete the Motorcycle Safety Foundation's (MSF) Motorcycle Basic RiderCourse® To qualify for the waiver, the course must be given by an approved training provider in New York State. For information about the nearest course, visit www.nysmsp.org or call MSF at 1-800-446-9227.

Registration, Inspection, Insurance

Unlike most other motor vehicles, motorcycles are registered for one year rather than two, and all motorcycle registrations expire on April 30.

Motorcycles must be inspected at least once every 12 months at a station licensed by the DMV to perform motorcycle safety inspections. The station will display a yellow and black sign reading "Official NYS Motorcycle Inspection Station." Dealerships must inspect motorcycles prior to delivery. If purchased in a private sale, you will be given 10 days from the date of registration to have the motorcycle inspected.

Motorcycles are not included in the "no fault" insurance provisions that cover other motor vehicles in New York State. Motorcyclists owners and operators should know and understand the extent and limitations of their insurance coverage for themselves and their passengers.

Unlike other motor vehicles, liability insurance may be terminated on a motorcycle without a turn-in of the license plate at a DMV office. This makes it easier to put the motorcycle back on the road after winter storage. Under no circumstances may a motorcycle be operated on public highways without liability coverage. This also applies to motorcycles registered out-of-state.
