the Thousand Islands region with 29 lighthouses along the way. The <u>Lakes to Locks Passage</u> between Manhattan and Montreal and the <u>Mohawk Towpath Byway</u> are drive-through history museums of canals, battlegrounds, and stately architecture. Between Rochester and Buffalo, vast <u>Letchworth State Park</u> is called the Grand Canyon of the East. Lakes country cruisers can circumnavigate Cayuga Lake for glittering views, rolling through <u>Taughannock Falls State</u> <u>Park</u> and past the tallest shear-drop waterfall east of the Rockies. Route 10 between Walton and Deposit is one of the most scenic stretches in the state.

Themed Runs

Websites like <u>Motorcycle Roads</u> suggest themed runs from day outings to several-day odysseys. The <u>Montauk Lighthouse Run</u> from Holbrook to Montauk Point passes wine orchards and farms with plenty of Long Island wildlife and ends at <u>Montauk Point Lighthouse</u>. You can spend several days exploring haunted roads on a Sleepy Hollow tour with a stop at the infamous <u>cemetery</u>, through Washington Irving country's misty back roads and covered bridges.

New York State Motorcycle Safety Program

New to motorcycling? The <u>New York State Motorcycle Safety Program</u> (NYSMSP) offers basic to advanced instruction that can get you wheeling in no time. The program trains 18,000 motorcyclists each year at over 40 training sites throughout the state.







Common Motorcycle Accident Causes

It is time to be aware of what commonly causes accidents for riders on motorcycles. There are so many different factors that can contribute to accidents, but, for the most part, they can be summed up with three categories – experience, impairment, and ability.

The Inexperienced Motorcycle Rider

Every motorcycle rider starts somewhere, and that is usually as a beginner. In most circumstances, riders are either scared to death or overly confident (there is very little in-between). Inexperienced riders don't know their limits, and they often overestimate the motorcycle's limits. Fair assumption? Most new riders are urged to take a beginning motorcycle riding course to prepare them for what to do in an emergency, how to handle the motorcycle, and all the other scenarios they might face. Not every rider will do this, making the inexperienced rider on the road even more dangerous.

The Impaired Motorcycle Rider

Alcohol and drugs in the system (in excess) can bring a false sense of confidence in some people. Fatigue is just as worse, too. We already know that drinking, drugged and fatigue driving is not safe in a car – why would reducing the frame and wheel number make it any safer?

Impaired motorcycle riders create dangerous situations on the roadways for themselves and other vehicles around them. New and veteran riders can fall into this trap – there is no group of riders safe from this type of accident statistic.

The "Always in a Hurry" Motorcycle Rider

Slow down, Speed Racer! Where do you need to get to so fast?

We are all guilty of speeding when we are in a hurry. It is an instinct that if we press down on the accelerator a little harder, we will get there a little quicker. The science is there – go faster, take less time. The part that doesn't necessarily get thrown in there is **Newton's Third Law of Motion** - "For every action, there is an equal and opposite reaction." Let that sink in. The faster you go, the less time it will take, but the more likely you will be to put yourself (or someone else) in danger. You have seen fast riders on the road and thought to yourself, "they are going to cause an accident." Then you are much more aware. Speeding is part of the ability factor of riding a motorcycle.



We also work with allies in Canada, Europe and Asia to influence talks on vehicle globalizationand harmonization that are proceeding under the United Nations and the World Health Organization.

History of the MRF

The first words of the street rider's first voice in Washington were uttered in 1985 in St. Louis, Missouri. There, the very founders of the motorcyclists' rights movement in America gathered for a meeting of the minds. Leaders of State Motorcyclists' Rights Organizations (SMROs), they wanted to catapult to the national scene the clout and effectiveness of SMROs — the strong, effective grassroots of state-based motorcyclists' rights.

They knew it had to be done. Riders' rights had to go national, because the threat was national. Our founders at this meeting of the minds shared a keen sense that danger was not just on the horizon but dead ahead, as freedom's foes had just attacked with a ban on motorcycles in the United States Congress.

They knew it had to be done right. The founders wanted a staff that was all muscle and no fat, supported not by casual members but driven by a team of dedicated volunteers, with each volunteer committed to shouldering his or her share of the demands of liberty. They envisioned a team committed to core values like respect for riders' diverse lifestyles and opinions, integrity in conduct, excellence and boldness in facing challenges head-on and, above all, leadership — leadership in the unrelenting struggle for the safety and freedom of American motorcyclists.

So, at a meeting of the minds of grassroots leaders, a new leader was born: The Motorcycle Riders Foundation. The first motorcyclists' rights advocacy organization with a full-time legislative and political presence in our nation's capital. The only Washington voice devoted exclusively to you, the street rider. And each year, the leaders of the now-worldwide community gather for motorcycling's premier political leadership summit — named to commemorate the gathering at which we were founded: The MRF Meeting of the Minds.

Throughout the USA and across the world, the torch of freedom burns in the hearts of motorcyclists. One by one, they recognize the need to become volunteers as co-partners in an organization committed to integrity, respect, leadership, teamwork and excellence.
