There will Not be any Membership Meetings this month although the Board will still meet and begin to prepare for the upcoming year.







In late 2011, US Spyder Ryders was founded by a group of individuals in the Central Florida Area who felt the need for fellowship among the quickly growing community of Can-Am On Road Owners. As part of the ryding club's charter, the founding members believed that not only should the community of Spyder Ryders have fun promoting the Can-Am products they were growing to love, but also felt helping the community in which they live was something close to their hearts. The Long Island Chapter was founded 8 years later in 2019 by Jarred Knoetgen.

The LI Chapter, as with most of the world, was impacted by the COVID pandemic but regained momentum in 2022. The current chapter President, Craig Romain, and Vice President, Angela Rine, have worked with the other club officers to organize a fantastic 2022 season for the club.

The LI Chapter of the US Spyder Ryders holds a monthly meeting for all active and prospective members. This chapter also had scheduled rides for essentially every weekend throughout the 2022 season including mostly rides in Nassau and Suffolk counties but a few longer rides up to Hunter Mountain and Hawk's Nest. It is the common goal of our members and chapters to pride ourselves on our community service activities, as we believe strongly in doing good while having fun. As part of the community service activities, we hold food drive events in support of local food banks, contribute to veteran programs, and partake in other local charity events such as law enforcement rides and rides to support children in need. While helping our veterans, US Spyder Ryders strongly support two charities within the veteran community. One of those charities being the Road Warrior Foundation, a charity that provides adventures to improve the lives of veterans and empower them through challenges that honor their service, and the second being the Tunnel to Towers Foundation. This program provides mortgage-free homes to our nation's catastrophically injured veterans and first responders, as well as provides mortgage-free homes to Gold Star families and Fallen First Responder families with young children. Locally, the US Spyder Ryders supports Melissa's Wish, a not-for-profit organization founded with the purpose of providing short term, nonmedical financial aid, in the form of a grant, to the caregivers assisting those afflicted with a serious illness, injury or end of life event.

Today, with 70 chapters across the United States, the US Spyder Ryders continues to strive toward promoting Can-Am products, along with helping our communities. Membership in the LI Chapter is open to any owner or passenger of a 2 or 3 wheeled vehicle that requires a helmet.

Over-the-Counter (OTC) Hearing Aids are Here! Are They Right for Me?

Over-the-counter (OTC) hearing aids became available at your local retailer and online effective October 17, 2022. According to one study, 86% of Americans 50 and older with hearing loss do not wear hearing aids. The FDA approved OTC hearing aids as a means for increasing access to treatment for these individuals. They are convenient to buy, cheaper than prescription hearing aids, and do not require a prescription or a hearing test.

While OTC hearing aids might seem like a straightforward self -serve way to get treatment for your hearing loss, they are not meant for everyone. OTC devices are only for adults (18+) with perceived mild to moderate hearing loss. They are selffitting, so you must adjust the devices yourself. This likely will require you to have some degree of tech savvy, or know someone who does that can help.

Like any medical device, OTC hearing aids should be purchased with caution. While these devices may work well for some, they are NOT recommended for people with moderate to severe hearing loss, or those who struggle to hear conversations in quiet settings. They also are not appropriate for children younger than 18, adults with dementia, or people who show signs of a potential medical problem like sudden hearing loss, tinnitus in one ear, or noticeably poorer hearing in one ear than the other.

It can be difficult to navigate through the world of hearing assistance technology without the help of a hearing professional. One study found that 73% of participants chose the wrong hearing aid based on their audiogram. Hearing loss is a health care issue and should be treated as such. Every patient's needs are different, and a consultation with an audiologist can help you decide if OTC hearing aids are a good fit for you. Whether you opt for an over-the-counter or prescription model, it makes good sense to have a hearing test before making a purchase. You will gain a clear understanding of your specific hearing loss and the audiologist can provide details on what to expect with treatment, no matter what option you choose. The audiologist also will determine if your hearing loss may be caused by a more serious underlying medical condition that could have long-term consequences for your health, and connect you with the appropriate care.

YES ... over-the-counter hearing aids are convenient, relatively inexpensive, and easily accessible.
BUT ... they are not appropriate for everyone, are not professionally programmed to your hearing loss, and do not offer the level of support that comes with prescription hearing aids and ongoing professional care.
SO ... if you opt for OTC hearing aids, don't go it alone. Seek out an audiologist who can provide guidance and support on your hearing loss journey, and perhaps offer a service plan for your OTC devices.



WHO WE ARE

The Motorcycle Riders Foundation is the Nation's premiere motorcyclists' rights organization that is chiefly concerned with issues at the national and international levels that impact the freedom and safety of American street motorcyclists. We are also committed to educating rights advocates to improve effectiveness at the state and local levels. The MRF works together with street motorcyclists, State Motorcyclists' Rights Organizations (SMROs), the motorcycle industry, the media and other organizations, assisting them with state and local agendas as well as working with them to influence action and policy in Washington, DC - from the Congress to government departments and agencies to the Office of the President of the United States. We also work with allies in Canada, Europe and Asia to influence talks on vehicle globalizationand harmonization that are proceeding under the United Nations and the World Health Organization.



History of the MRF

The first words of the street rider's first voice in Washington were uttered in 1985 in St. Louis, Missouri. There, the very founders of the motorcyclists' rights movement in America gathered for a meeting of the minds. Leaders of State Motorcyclists' Rights Organizations (SMROs), they wanted to catapult to the national scene the clout and effectiveness of SMROs — the strong, effective grassroots of statebased motorcyclists' rights.

They knew it had to be done. Riders' rights had to go national, because the threat was national. Our founders at this meeting of the minds shared a keen sense that danger was not just on the horizon but dead ahead, as freedom's foes had just attacked with a ban on motorcycles in the United States Congress.

They knew it had to be done right. The founders wanted a staff that was all muscle and no fat, supported not by casual members but driven by a team of dedicated volunteers, with each volunteer committed to shouldering his or her share of the demands of liberty. They envisioned a team committed to core values like respect for riders' diverse lifestyles and opinions, integrity in conduct, excellence and boldness in facing challenges head-on and, above all, leadership — leadership in the unrelenting struggle for the safety and freedom of American motorcyclists.

So, at a meeting of the minds of grassroots leaders, a new leader was born: The Motorcycle Riders Foundation. The first motorcyclists' rights advocacy organization with a full-time legislative and political presence in our nation's capital. The only Washington voice devoted exclusively to you, the street rider. And each year, the leaders of the nowworldwide community gather for motorcycling's premier political leadership summit — named to commemorate the gathering at which we were founded: The MRF Meeting of the Minds.

Throughout the USA and across the world, the torch of freedom burns in the hearts of motorcyclists. One by one, they recognize the need to become volunteers as co-partners in an organization committed to integrity, respect, leadership, teamwork and excellence.
