Greetings members of Long Island ABATE! The recent weather has welcomed some to start the riding season early. Please be attentive to the road conditions, whether it be icy spots left in shaded areas of the road, or the over sanding of some streets. Although many if not all potholes have been filled, please keep in mind many are still dangerously hiding! As a motorcyclist, we always must be careful as we ride! As you may know, I have been assigned as our safety officer who attends Suffolk County police precinct community meetings. The meetings give information from the precinct inspector to the community attendees from law enforcement statistics on burglary, larceny, homicide,

theft, break-ins and vehicular accidents including motorcycles. Usually a map of the district will contain the various locations of these crimes. Most meetings occur during the day but some have also been scheduled for evenings. If you are interested in attending these meetings or following your Suffolk County Police Precinct, you can use PIXEL to keep you informed. All you have to do is place your zip code in the form on line. At the end of these meetings the public is encouraged to ask questions or share policing issues by calling 311 and reporting the issue.

I also was asked to attend and join the Suffolk County Traffic Safety Board. This group of safety minded law enforcement members give their input about specific topics and issues they become aware of. My part is to make them aware of the issues pertaining to all motorcycles. Autonomous vehicles that don't "see" motorcycles, profiling of motorcyclists, road hazards like the use of wire guardrails, potholes or other hazards on the road. Recently I was asked to send in a resume and possibly join the board! I'm thrilled to be asked and I hope the board allows an ABATE officer to join. I hope you can share and recruit ABATE membership to your fellow riders or those just interested in motorcycle issues. Membership is a mere \$25.00 per year and really worth the cost. A no cost \$4,000 insurance policy is included! Did you know we have meetings on the second Tuesday of the month in Suffolk at the BPOE Elks building in Centereach and then the third Tuesday in Nassau at the Marine Corp League in Massapequa?

We just announced some events for Awareness, Veterans Day, camping out and a Toy Run!

I look forward to seeing you at the bike nights and at our meetings! Long Island ABATE is your advocate for all motorcyclists! We fight for your rights and lobby for legislation to protect them! Ride safe!

March Madness

If I was a college basketball fan this month of March would be a big deal with the NCAA playoffs, sweet 16, elite 8, final 4, and the championship game. But I'm not that into it. But I think March brings a different kind of madness when you're a biker and you happen to live in New York, or other areas where riding your scoot may not be viable 12 months a year. Although this year has not been as cold.

That being said I know I get at least a bit land locked during the winter without being able to ride that much, particularly myself still physically sensitive from by past year of health challenges. I'm getting stir crazy, going mad so to speak, as I'm sure you all are also. Just gotta ride, get in the wind and enjoy not being caged. You

live with the cold and get on the bike, layer up and go. But it's kind of a treacherous time a bit. You can underestimate the dangers out there.

You may stay out too late and black ice can form, a residue of remnant leaves that haven't been totally removed from the fall, winter leave fall. I don't know about some of you but I've had times I didn't gauge the temperature correctly, went out for a ride, enjoyed the ride and finally getting out there. But somewhere during the ride, usually at the farthest distance from home the temp drops and I'm trying to beat almost hypothermia getting home. Getting there and uncontrollably shivering for a half an hour or so.

At that point I think the thrill and fun of the ride was worth it. I think, maybe. But I paid a price I wasn't counting on. I've done that quite a few times, and will probably be doing it again. But what drives you to do it? Because you've been going mad, getting frustrated every time you go in your garage and see your bike, knowing what could be. Daring the elements, cursing the elements, because they're keeping you from your desired passion.

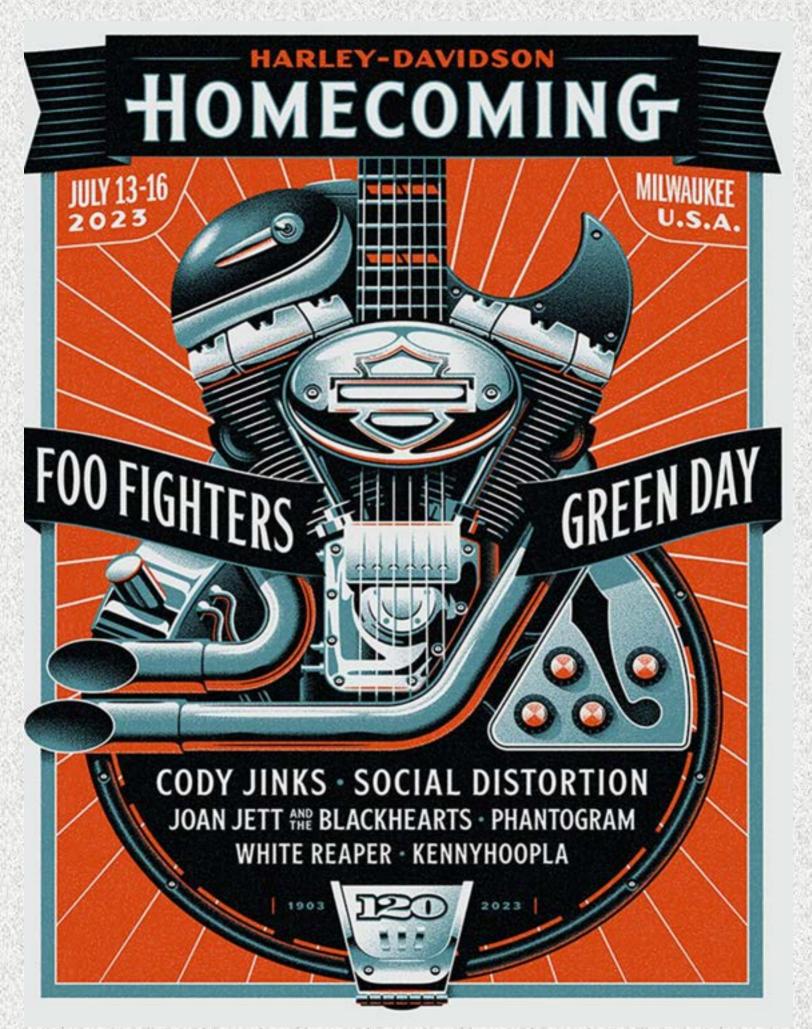
It is at this point you need to have wisdom. I know having God in my life has kept me from going mad and doing rash things at times. God saves me from myself time and time again. I'd be out riding this evening to the ABATE meeting, but my lungs aren't 100% yet and who knows what could happen. But my desire to do what I love to do for people overrides my mad desire to just get on the bike and throw all caution.... "to the wind", as they say. How appropriate. So my point is having God in your life can and often protects you from very stupid decisions that you get away with many times, but it only takes once.
