



#### The Price of Apathy

As patriotic Americans, we often talk about the price of freedom. We talk about the sacrifices required to protect our rights and about those who came before us, people of integrity who oftentimes gave everything they had in pursuit of an ideal;of a country and a way of life where our children and grandchildren cangrow up proud to be Americans, unapologetically embracing a system of government that many other people in the world would love to have. We talk about our service men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice, and we are thankful to live in a country that allows us to live our lives as we please,

toenjoy the freedom provided by our Constitution, to be able to participate in what laws are passed and which ones aren't, and to teach our values to future generations.

In the motorcyclists' rights world, we also talk about guarding against undue government intrusion into our livesand warn against the influence of mainstreammedia propaganda aimed at tearing down some of our most basic and cherished beliefs. When you get right down to it, that's why the motorcyclists' rights movement exists. It's where we started and why we still fight for our rights at every turn. As past MRF President Karen Bolin once said, "We're in the freedom business."

Now consider the price of apathy, of seeing what's around us, knowing that some of what's happening is wrong, and doing nothing. Doing nothing, of course, is taking the easy way out. In many cases it's the old 'not in my backyard' philosophy of 'If it doesn't affect me directly, why should I worry about it?'

The challenges facing motorcycling today are among the most serious ever, and those challenges are – like it or not - in everyone's backyard. The MRF and our partners in state motorcyclists' rights organizations are fighting for the right to repair our own bikes, without being forced to have services that we could easily manage ourselves be performed by dealerships charging exorbitant rates. We're fighting to protect consumer choice through a strong aftermarket, ensuring that we have access to the vast number of options on parts the aftermarket gives us, parts that are many times better and cheaper than what we'd get from the OEMs.We're fighting to keep unsafe software being used in autonomous, self-driving cars and trucks from being tested on our nation's roadways and killing bikers in the process. We're fighting to keep our ability to buy fuel that won't destroy our engines, as will be the case if gasoline with 15% ethanol becomes our only choice. We're fighting to preserve internal combustion engines, rather than being forced to buy electric vehicles at a time when neither the battery technology nor a sufficient charging infrastructure to support such vehicles is in place. We're fighting to prevent unfair profiling of motorcycle riders. And the list goes on.

So, what price apathy? A riding public that chooses to ignore the threats to motorcycling while sitting idly by, expecting others to do the hard work of protecting our rights and our lifestyle, is arguably the biggest threat we face. Ask yourself: Should we, through our actions, control our own destiny? Forge our own futures? Or should we sit back, foolishly believing that the government knows best how we should run our lives and hoping for the best. There are roughly 8 million registered motorcyclists in America. If even a small percentage of that group were to join with the MRF and our partners in our mission to preserve motorcycling, imagine what we could do. Then imagine what will happen if the vast majority of those 8 million riders choose to do nothing.

Since 1987, there's only been one organization exclusively devoted to protecting the rights and lifestyle of street riding motorcyclists in the halls of Congress, and that's the Motorcycle Riders Foundation. To those of you who are already members of NHMROand the MRF, thank you. You've already proven that you're committed to helping protect and preserve motorcycling. That said, we still need your help.

All of us have friends who are not members. If you're not an MRF member, please help us by joining. If you're already a member, please renew your membership each year, and of equal importance, please sign up one of your friends as a new MRF member.

The price of apathy is the loss of freedom, an open invitation to tyranny, and – without a strong MRF - could well be the end of motorcycling as we know it.



## Don't Have A Truck? Haul Your Motorcycle With This...

## Joe Hauler Deluxe Cam-Loc Carrier

Motorcycle carriers that mount to your vehicle's hitch can prove to be incredibly convenient for all manner of reasons. The biggest reason being that it will allow you to carry a motorcycle with a vehicle that could not otherwise. Maybe you're not willing to give up the convenience of your SUV just to haul a motorcycle now and then, or maybe you just like the idea of being able to stow the carrier when you're not using it. Maybe you hate trucks?

There is a wide range of hitch-mounted carriers on the market. You'll want to make sure you're buying one that is well-made, especially if you plan on putting a street bike's worth of heft on it. You'll also want to be sure your vehicle can withstand the weight of the carrier and motorcycle. Even the two-wheeler you plan to use it for should be considered. For example, scooters have a serious rear weight bias. If you get a carrier only rated for the weight of your scooter, and most of that weight is being held on one side, you're going have a bad time.

The Joe Hauler carriers are some of the strongest and solidly built carriers I've seen on the market. The all-welded steel construction hints at the carrier's stout build. Also, included is a ramp which can be secured during use and bolted to the carrier when you're on the road. There's nothing to bolt together once it's received. Joe Hauler makes a variety of carriers from single and double carriers designed for dirtbikes, to super heavy-duty products able to withstand "any size motorcycle" not limited to "full-dress" cruisers, Gold Wings, etc. The Joe Hauler carriers will fit any Class III two-inch receiver, are powder coated black, and come with a three year warranty. The Joe Haulers themselves go up in weight as their weight ratings increase (as to be expected), and due to the welded construction, require truck freight to ship.





#### **October is Audiology Awareness Month**

When I tell people that I'm an audiologist during casual conversations with friends and family, I'm often greeted with "What's that?", or worse, a blank stare. So, since October is Audiology Awareness Month, I would like to take this opportunity to help grow public awareness of what "audiology" is and offer some trivia about the development of this highly specialized field.

What is Audiology? Audiology is the branch of science dedicated to the study of hearing, balance, and their associated disorders.

What is an Audiologist?An audiologist is a healthcare professional who provides patient-centered care in the prevention, identification, diagnosis, and treatment of hearing, balance, and other auditory disorders for people of all ages. Audiologists have extensive education and training in the field of Audiology, and have earned a specialized graduate degree in this area of study.

Why see an Audiologist for my hearing concerns? Hearing care is health care. Hearing and balance disorders are complex with medical, psychological, physical, social, educational, and employment implications. Audiologists provide professional and personalized services to minimize the negative impact of these disorders, leading to improved outcomes and enhanced quality of life.

Major Milestones in Audiology's History - here's a timeline of crucial events:

- 4<sup>th</sup> Century B.C. Hippocrates, the famous Greek doctor, uses clinical research to try to find the cause of hearing loss, which he attributes to weather changes, the direction of winds, and skull trauma.
- 4<sup>th</sup> Century A.D. Alexander of Tralles, a physician, uses two methods to treat hearing loss herbs and blowing a trumpet in the ear canal.
- 1898 Miller Reese Hutchison invents the Akouphone, the first electronic hearing aid.
- 1920s The audiometer, which allows for precise measurement of hearing loss, is invented.
- 1940s Many World War II service people return stateside with noise-induced hearing loss, spurring the government to create hearing rehabilitation programs at military hospitals.
- 1946 The term "audiology" first appears in print in the Journal of Speech Disorders and the Volta Review.
- 1946 Raymond Carhart, known as "the Father of Audiology," invents speech audiometry, a method he employs to evaluate how well hearing aid users understand speech.
- 1953–1958 The invention of the transistor and integrated circuit revolutionizes the design of hearing aids they go from pocket-size to small enough to fit on the head or in the ear canal.
- 1961 William House installs the first cochlear implant in a patient.
- 1962 Marion Downs creates the first infant hearing screening program for the early detection of hearing loss.
- 1977 The Academy of Doctors of Audiology is founded.
- 1978 The American Speech-Language-Hearing Association is founded.
- 1994 The first Au.D. (doctorate in audiology) training program begins at Baylor University.
- 2007 All new audiology practitioners are required to have an Au.D.

Today, the field of audiology continues to evolve as technology and research advances. However, the goal of audiological care is the same as in the past – to improve each patient's ability to hear, communicate, and live well.



Needles Highway. 300 plus turns, in a way similar to the Tail of The Dragon. One thing that presented all kinds of challenges were the switchbacks. I'm more of a cruising kind of guy, and I understand the intrigue with the continuous maneuvering but having to be that intensely "on" not my choice of roads. The switchback, the sharp u-turns and at times more than u-turns with speed limit signs at 10MPH creates a very tense experience for me. Particularly when countless bikes are coming at you from the



opposite direction, not to mention the crew you're riding with in front and back.

Move too slow and you drop the bike, move too fast and you could be in the oncoming lane headed for a head on collision. So it takes intense concentration and excellent discernment on when to slowdown and speed up, working the clutch and throttle in a precise way with perseverance and knowledge of your bike, road conditions and all around you. One miss-hap could be disastrous or even deadly. Almost the ultimate living on the edge. But that's the biker way isn't it.

We go through times in our life when there are times of switchbacks. So much going on and you need to change course, direction, move faster, then slow down. To accomplish what you are created to do in life you need to know when to move quickly, when to have patience. Hit the throttle and move when there is clear sailing in the direction your life is going. But always being ready to change in a moments time when a curve comes into your life. Some people's lives seem to have more switchback seasons than others. But wisdom is paramount.


