I remember being on interstate 15 going from Las Vegas to Los Angeles many years ago. I was making a move from Long Island to Southern California. I passed through Vegas at maybe midnight or so and I remember it was the darkest night that t I had ever experienced in my life. Still is. With no other cars on the road in either direction it was uncomfortably dark. Don't know if you've experienced a night so dark it is really unsettling. I knew I was in a totally uninhabited area of the desert and the nearest town Baker a long way off according to my Hagstrom's map. Dating myself a bit. My car overheated and I had to pull over. 1984, no cell service, I mean no cell phones period. Had just started to come out for the public.

I turned the car off and with no light I couldn't see my had 2 inches from my face. I went to get out of the car to look under the hood with a flashlight and as I got around to the front

of the car I became aware of the sound of what in my mind was countless rattlesnakes. It could have been only a few, I don't know because I could not see. I jumped on the hood, climbed on the roof reached down and opened the door and slid down in and locked myself in. As I think back from today, if I had broken down on my bike in that place, I can't imagine what my state of mind would have been. Well I limped through the night a mile or two at a time, stopping to cool the car down. Got some work done the next day and finished the trip, but the car was never the same.

So what's my point here? Much of our life, with many all of their life people are on their life's journey in the dark, no idea what is around them, possibilities, dangers as well as where is life actually taking them. Being "in the dark" is a common cliché when you something is going on and others may know but you don't. I understand you can never quite know what life holds. Believe me I've been through too many things I didn't see coming. Much of the time life can be as dark as a tunnel you're traveling in only nothing to light up what's around you except unrealized dreams guide you like a headlight. At least you have some sense of direction. But you can't see the "light at the end of the tunnel. You think it's there, have a sense it has to be there. But many time you're chasing windmills like Don Quixote thinking you're conquering dragons along the way but living an illusion.

Faith in something real, something that has promised to be there when you get there changes things. You may be in that dark tunnel, or on route 15 on the way to your destination. But in addition to your headlights giving you some distance of sight, you also have the light in the distance that shows the way, and gives you the reality there is actually something out there when you arrive. Such a difference in the journey.

When that faith is in something true, real and alive and waiting. What occurs is because the destination is a living entity, if you break down in the dark times of life and you can't go on because of fear, brokenness and your paralyzed in that place, you look up and notice the light now is coming towards you to meet you in that place. That I've found to be the truth of faith in the God of the bible, and Is Son Jesus. As your moving towards Him, He is also moving towards you. So no matter how messed up the journey might get, or is Jesus will meet you in the perfect time in the perfect place and change everything because He is the light and at that moment you never travel in the dark again.





How Your Hearing Affects Your Balance

What many don't know is there is a link between hearing and balance. When hearing is compromised, our balance can suffer. Sounds odd, but it's true. The vestibular system is responsible for your sense of balance and is located in the inner ear, detecting movements to provide awareness of spatial orientation.

Vestibular disorders can result in symptoms of dizziness (feeling lightheaded or unsteady), vertigo (sensation of spinning or tilting, or that your surroundings are rotating), imbalance, and falls.

Multiple studies have confirmed that untreated hearing loss is linked to imbalance and falls. A 2012 study by Johns Hopkins University determined that even a mild hearing loss triples the risk of falls among the elderly. However, results also suggested that treating hearing loss with hearing devices can help reduce this risk of falling.

Another study published in 2014 by the Washington University School of Medicine confirmed that enhancing hearing improves the balance of adults experiencing hearing loss. In the study, patients who wore hearing devices performed better on balance tests when their devices were on versus when they were off.

Professor of Otolaryngology, Timothy Hullar, M.D., suggested this was due to more than just improved alertness. He hypothesized that we use sound to tell where we are in space, similar to how sight helps orient us.

If you have untreated hearing loss and experience imbalance, dizziness, or vertigo, schedule an appointment with H.E.A.R.S. Audiology for a comprehensive audiological evaluation.

Antique Mini Engine Kits .. Christmas Gift ?






For motorcycle enthusiasts, an appropriate choice is this Retrol V-Twin motorcycle engine kit, which sells for \$899.99. This kit is a 1/5 scale model of the Harley-Davidson Knucklehead motorcycle engine that was introduced in 1936. This engine kit is made of brass and stainless steel and comes with a flat wooden base for mounting.

The four-stroke gas-powered engine includes an adjustable carburetor, and each cylinder has a bore of 13 millimeters and stroke of 16 millimeters, making the engine's

total displacement 4.2 cubic centimeters. The engine takes a 1/4-32 Thread ME8 Spark Plug and requires a pre-mixed 25/1 fuel/oil blend to run properly.

It can be started with a power drill or the included pull start cord, and the spark is provided by three AA batteries, which are not included in the kit.


