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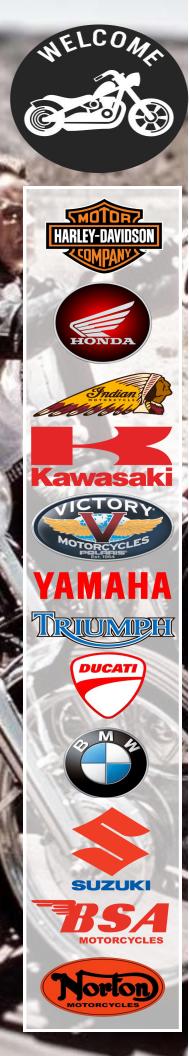

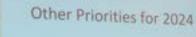

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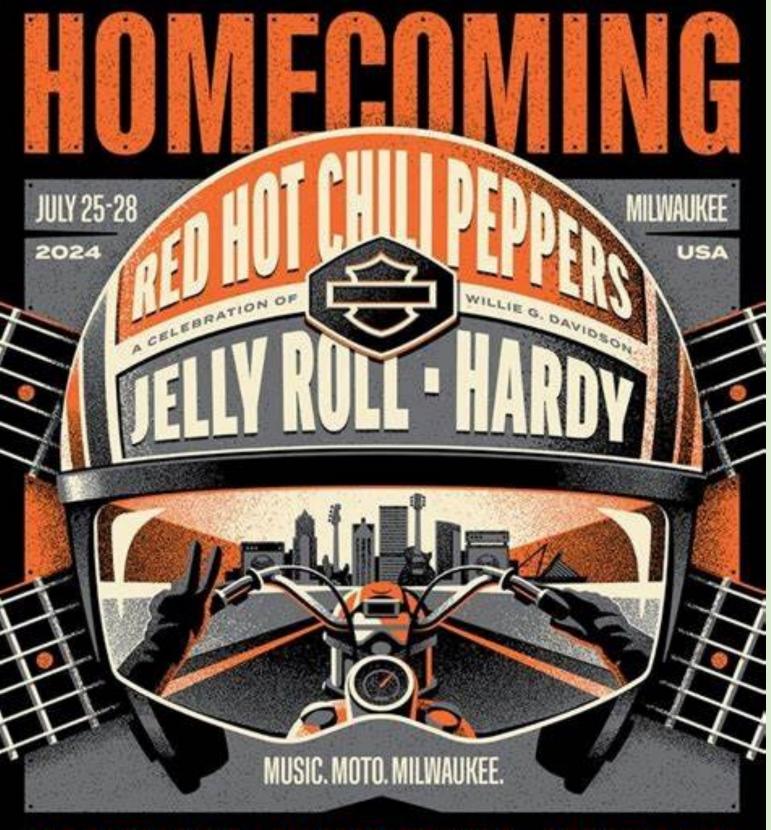

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### A Message From Your Road Captain

For those that don't know, my name is Constantine Mourelatos Jr. I am a motorcycle safety foundation rider coach. I've been riding motorcycles for 37 years, I love and ride most disciplines of motorcycling (touring, super-sport, adventure, super-moto and off-road). Because I am a firm advocate of motorcycle safety, I will concentrate my newsletters on safety, statistics, education, and training.

This month's topic will be following distance. After last month's statistic meeting, one of the most common reasons for motorcycle accidents is because riders follow too closely to other vehicles, even though every crash has a multitude of factors, this one stood out, and can be prevented.

The rule is to keep at least a two second lead time. Meaning it should take you at least two seconds to pass an object that the vehicle in front of you has passed. Most riders I observe ride inside of this two second lead time, even though following too closely most riders under normal breaking situations will be able to stop their motorcycle. The danger occurs when the vehicle in front of you brakes without warning. Emergency braking on a motorcycle is a skill that needs to be practiced over and over to build muscle memory. Emergency braking under duress usually ends in disaster without the proper practice and training. Motorcycles, for the most part, stop better than cars do. It takes skill and practice on a motorcycle to reach threshold braking: getting maximum traction and stopping power without skidding or losing control of the motorcycle. Most motorcyclists cannot accomplish threshold braking because it is a skill they have not practiced. If you are not an accomplished motorcyclist that can achieve threshold braking, I suggest moving your lead time back at least another second or two. Even if you can achieve threshold braking: extra lead time = more safety, emergency braking under duress is never something I want to do and should never have to if I have a good lead time. The goal is to keep us out of these situations.

Total breaking distance on a motorcycle has three parts:

Perception: when you realize you have to brake Reaction: the time it takes you to roll off your throttle and get to your brakes Braking: the distance it takes you to stop once you get to your brakes

Most humans have anywhere from a .75 to a 1.5 second perception/reaction time. Realize that at 60 miles an hour you are traveling 88 ft./s. When a vehicle emergency brakes in front of you and you are within that two second lead time your stop will have to be extreme, because one second of the time will be getting to your brakes.

"For the motorcyclist, crashing into a breaking car poses especially high risk. Even when the speed is minimal, and 10 mph is enough – the rider will be thrown over his bike (usually with horrific consequences for his legs because the handlebars are in the way). The rider collides with the rear end of the car, at the same moment the motorcycle bounces backward a little, as if to make room for the rider who falls neatly through this gap between the car and the motorcycle and lands on the road. In the next moment, the gap closes itself again: the still moving motorcycle, which was slowed only by its initial impact, crashes once again (usually already half on its side) into the car, which has since come to a stop and then pushes the rider under the rear end of the car.

In spite of this danger, one constantly sees clueless rider's, including quite accomplished ones who not only carelessly follow a car far too closely but also tend to position themselves precisely in the middle of the lane and thus in a position in which, if the car were to suddenly slow, the chances of being able to ride past it are the worst. The possibilities for swerving around a suddenly appearing obstacle are significantly reduced and are often vastly overestimated, just as most riders misjudge what constitutes a safe following distance and follow too closely.

There is a riding exercise to cure this: have an instructor ride at a constant speed preferably in a car in front of the rider but one lane over. The rider's task is to maintain the following distance that allows him to bring the motorcycle safely to a stop in the event that the vehicle ahead suddenly stops. If the instructor breaks to a standstill without warning, the rider is almost always surprised and, in most instances, ends up beside the car, ahead or even beyond it. Once one has experienced this for themselves, he or she will see how they've been putting themselves at great risk."

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## GEAR UP FOR SAFETY

#### Output Contracted Head

Florida law requires motorcycle riders and pataengers under age 21 to wear a helmet. Riders under age 16 must wear helmets on scooters and mopeds less than 50cc.

#### Headphones |

It is negal to wear headphones, headsets, or earphones in both ears while riding.

#### Unprotected Eyes

Riding a motorcycle without eye protection is against the law.

#### Bare Hands, Arms, and Legs

Expose you to debris, suntourn, and wind. Even regular jeans and clothes won't protect you from cuts or "road rash" (n a crash.

#### Dark Clothing

Makes you invisible to motorists and increases your chances of being hit by other vehicles.

#### Broken Headlights

Daytime running lights are required on motorcycles and will turn on automatically when the motorcycle is running. A broken headlight reduces your visibility and increases your crash risk.

#### Open-Toed-Shoes

Flip-flops, slides, and sandals expose feet to injuries from debris, and burns from the engine/exhaust.

> Wearing a helmet reduces the risk of head injury by 69%. Ride smart, and always wear your safety gear! 0.0

#### Helmet 🗇

A securely fastened USDOT-compliant helmet safeguards against severe brain injuries in a crash. It is the most essential gear for motorcycle, scotter, and moped riders.

#### Headsets 🥝

Legal when installed in helmets where speaker do not come into direct contact with ears or hearing aids.

#### Eye Protection 😎

Required by law. Shatter-proof eye protection such as face shields or goggles can prevent eye injuries.

#### Protective Gear O

Clothing designed for motorcyclists can keep you safe from injury and shield you from the sun, wind, and rain.

#### Extra Headlights 📀

Additional lights or "ancillary" lights increase a motorcyclist's visibility to other motorists. By alerting others to your presence on the road, you reduce your chance of tering involved in a crash.

#### Bright/Reflective Clothing

Motorcyclists who are visible are less likely to have their right-of-way violated.

#### Boots O

Protect against foot and ankle injuries and provide grip for footrests and road surfaces.

#### Endorsement =Training

Riders are required by law to have a "motorcycle allog" or "motorcycle allog" license. All endorsed riders improve their safety by taking a required Basic Rider Course. If you are caught riding unendorsed, you will be arrested, and your motorcycle will be impounded.

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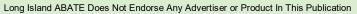

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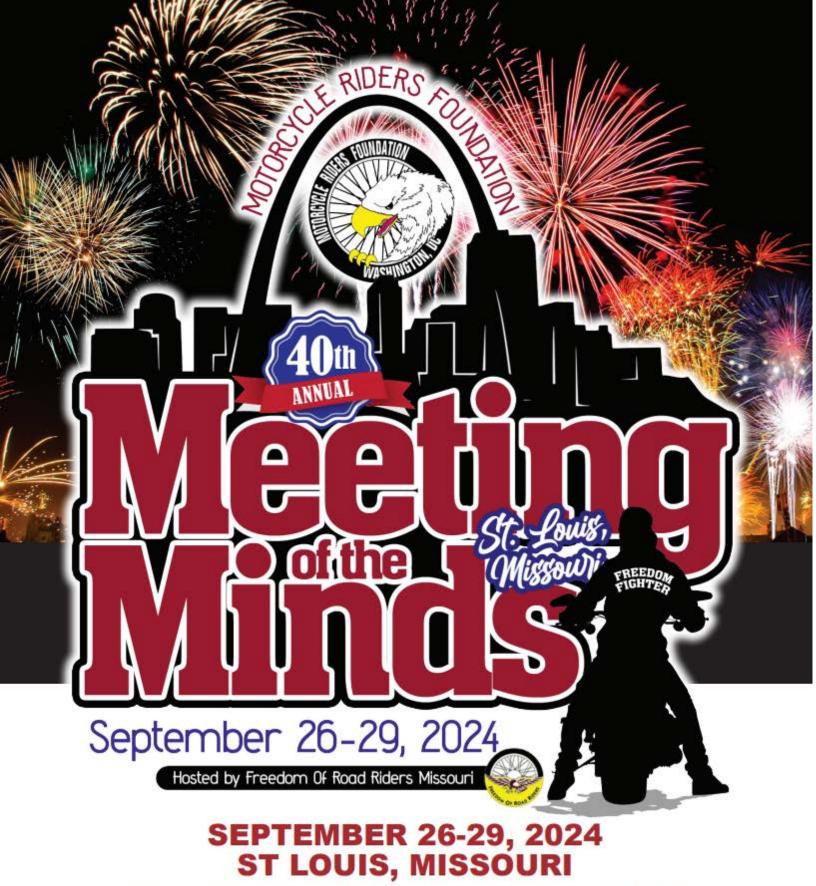


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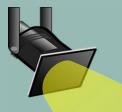

### **How Your Hearing Affects Your Balance**

What many don't know is there is a link between hearing and balance. When hearing is compromised, our balance can suffer. Sounds odd, but it's true. The vestibular system is responsible for your sense of balance and is located in the inner ear, detecting movements to provide awareness of spatial orientation.

Vestibular disorders can result in symptoms of dizziness (feeling lightheaded or unsteady), vertigo (sensation of spinning or tilting, or that your surroundings are rotating), imbalance, and falls.

Multiple studies have confirmed that untreated hearing loss is linked to imbalance and falls. A 2012 study by Johns Hopkins University determined that even a mild hearing loss triples the risk of falls among the elderly. However, results also suggested that treating hearing loss with hearing devices can help reduce this risk of falling.

Another study published in 2014 by the Washington University School of Medicine confirmed that enhancing hearing improves the balance of adults experiencing hearing loss. In the study, patients who wore hearing devices performed better on balance tests when their devices were on versus when they were off.

Professor of Otolaryngology, Timothy Hullar, M.D., suggested this was due to more than just improved alertness. He hypothesized that we use sound to tell where we are in space, similar to how sight helps orient us.
