The regular meeting of the Long Island ABATE was called to order at 7:32 PM on April 9, 2024 at the Elks Lodge by Chris Beckhans.

Pledge of Allegiance - Joe Schmid

Motion #1 made to accept the March meeting minutes, motion 2nd and carried.

Guest Speaker: Sergeant Brendon Pilkington and Scott _____. Sergeant Pilkington went over statistic for preliminary 2023 numbers. 2022 numbers are finalized. Sergeant Pilkington will forward Chris Beckhans the website so he can look up the statistics.

For 2023 – Fatal motorcycle crashes, Suffolk County leads with 19 or 11% of statewide. 12% from 2022. Queens had 17 which is an increase of 7 from 2022. Bronx 8; Kings 10; Staten Island 3 and NY 5 which is an increase of 17 fatalities from 2022.

61,610 motorcycle licenses

247 MC crashes resulting in per injury. 49 serious person injuries. They operate a state grant. Goal is to reduce MC fatalities and serious injuries. 378 down to 362 in crashes. 2023 Contributing factors:

#1 – 62 cases Failure to yield to right away. 57 due to speed. 51 passing improper lane change; 44 ______; 29 following closely; 68% killed between ages 30 and 59; 91% killed were male. 1% alcohol, driver distraction, traffic control, defective head light.

Of the 19, 2 of them 18-21; 7 are 21-29 and 4 our 30-59. 47 accidents Saturday and Sunday and 48 accidents during day. The largests number of crashes between 3pm to 6pm.

Fatal crashes 7 on Saturday. Most between 6-9pm. Most fatal injuries are from May to September. 6 of the fatal MC crashes involve e-scouters. 1 of fatal MC resulted in arrest of DWI of person who hit the motorcyclists. 8 motorcycle crashes in general resulted in DWI arrest. High crash locations: LIE 10 crashes; Sunrise Hwy – 14; 347 and 454.

Chris Beckhans will send a followup email to the Sergeant with follow up questions.

Presentation was finished at 8:19. There was a 10 minute break then the regular meeting started.

Report by Sherril Hart, Treasurer. There are 2 accounts. One for the Veterans and the General ABATE account. The general account has a total of \$37,000 and there was a transfer from the \$30,000 into the Veterans account. Deposit of \$670.24, paid out \$7,235.94 and paid storage \$461.00. The lottery fund has \$1,800.00.

Motion #2 made to accept the Treasurer report for March, motion 2nd and carried.

On 3/14/24 met with Joe Bart from USA Patriots and date for their game is 6/15/24.

Josephine with Chris Beckhans went to Suffolk Hog meeting and gave out medical information card. Also went to the Knights on Bike. They go indepth with the clubs about ABATE and then people will sign up. Some clubs will sign up the entire club.

Chris Beckhans met with Joel Geller from Gersh Academy about their private driving classes. ABATE will be doing it's education during these private driving classes.

On 3/24/24 was the St. Patrick's Day parade in Ronkonkoma which was a lot fun and good exposure for ABATE.

On 3/31/24 was the Easter Sunrise Service at Smith's Point Beach. About 150 bikes did show up for the service.

On 4/1/24 was the Suffolk County Veterans Marathon Awards event.

Booth supplies have been ordered and received.

A new booth tent was ordered.

Trauma kits have been purchase and will be in the truck.

Stop the Bleed class will be held on Friday, June 21 from 7pm to 9pm at the Elks. There will be a signup sheet. There is no charge. Stony Brook Hospital will presenting the class.

Update on the 4/28/24 Awareness Run.

Nick LaMorte – ABATE was recognized at the Dennison building.

Josephine Leonardi stated she is working on the hand books and they are coming along. She still has 3 open pages. Deposits should be done by next week. The handbooks should be at the awareness run. Camp Out will begin once the handbooks are complete.
