President's Message

Hello everyone,

March is here, although the riding weather hasn't been the greatest many have managed to sneak a few riding days in. With the weather being what it is it allows us to go over or have someone go over our machines. All things should be checked including tire condition and air pressures, all fluids checked and changed if needed, the brake system including pads, rotors, calipers, all hardware, and most of all the brake fluid (especially if



your machine has ABS). check all lights for proper function, check clutch for proper adjustment as well as all the components (including cable condition and lube it) if it is hydraulic check the fluid and flush if necessary. It is a good idea to check the handlebars and all controls including your mirrors and any accessories that you might have. It wouldn't hurt to check the year of your battery, and maybe have it tested, and change the battery in your fob if you have one. After all is said and done, check over your gear for proper condition, fit, and function. Once your machine and gear are good to go, I do recommend a little practice too. Whether you warm up in parking lot or sign up for a refresher course. There are various schools and practice sessions around Long Island, check our Facebook page as well as our website for updates.

With that out of the way I will recap some more of what we've been up to. After the ABATE of Pennsylvania's L&L seminar we had our Membership meeting, we swore in the rest of the Board and had a presentation by "Motorcycle" Mike Levine ESQ. (see pictures in this newsletter), He spoke about the importance of having enough Uninsured and Under insured coverage, especially since motorcyclists are not covered by No-fault insurance here in NY. Not many policies cover the rider and if they do it only covers up to twenty-five thousand dollars (at an additional cost), which in most cases is the ambulance ride and maybe a little more depending on the severity of the injuries from the crash. By having those limits raised to as much as you can afford you will be covering yourself in the event you are seriously injured, and the other party does not have enough insurance coverage to cover your injuries and losses. I recommend everyone look at there polices and consult their insurance company and or an Attorney for more information.

The following week we held the re-cap meeting in Massapequa. The weekend immediately after Bruce LaPorte from The Traveling Memorial Wall for Fallen Bikers came down and we hosted a Presenters meeting. There all attendees were brought up to speed with his presentation and received tips on how to present it at the school drivers ed classes. The group of presenters is growing and will allow us to reach more young drivers. I am so glad and proud to be part of such a dedicated group of individuals that care enough to be involved and make a difference. If anyone is interested in getting involved, we would love to have you. Please reach out to me or any Board member for more information. We will be participating in a few upcoming events including, possibly the Rocky Point and then the Ronkonkoma St Patty's Day Parades as well as the Middle Country Community Festival, immediately following is our Awareness Run, see the flyers in this newsletter for more information. Also check Facebook for updates. I look forward to seeing everyone soon.



Tax Tips for People with Hearing Loss

It's tax time again ... and who doesn't like to get a tax break? If you have hearing loss, you may qualify for special tax deductions for hearing-care-related expenses that can help reduce your overall tax burden – and keep more money in your pocket.

Enlisting the help of an accountant is always a good idea, but here's some general information about the IRS tax deductions that everyone with hearing loss should be aware of.

How Much Can I Claim?

If you itemize deductions instead of using the standard deduction, you can claim uninsured medical costs, *including those pertaining to hearing health care*, as a tax-deductible expense.

However, your overall uninsured medical expenses **must collectively total more than 7.5% of your adjusted gross income (AGI) for you to claim them as an itemized deduction**. For example, if your AGI is \$40,000, you may deduct the cost of any qualifying medical expenses over \$3,000. Since hearing devices can cost thousands of dollars and often are not covered by insurance, it's easy to see how medical expenses can add up fast.

What Expenses Can I Claim as a Deduction?

Uninsured hearing health costs you can claim as a medical expense include payments for:

- Hearing aids, batteries, repairs and maintenance
- Telephone equipment, including captioned phones, phones with special ringers and teleprinters, as well as their repair costs
- TVs and related accessories that provide captioning and amplify sound, as well as repair costs
- Improvements to your home for special burglar alarms, smoke detectors and doorbells
- Assistive devices such as TV streamers, remote mics, bed shakers, and sound machines for tinnitus relief
- Transportation to and from hearing health appointments
- Guide dog expenses, such as grooming, food costs and veterinary costs

Remember to keep the receipts for all related expenses—you'll need them handy when it's time to claim them on your taxes.

Are Hearing Device Donations Tax Deductible?

Yes! If you itemize deductions on your tax return rather than taking the standard deduction, you can claim a deduction for any hearing device donations.

Only donations made during the previous tax year are eligible for the tax benefit, and you may only deduct the fair market value. To determine the fair market value, use a five-year, straight-line depreciation formula:

- 1. Divide the original price of the devices by five to determine the annual depreciation
- 2. Multiply the annual depreciation by the age of the devices.
- 3. Subtract that figure from the original price to determine the remaining value.
