

. If your group or club would like us to attend an event or a meeting, please reach out to myself or a board member, we would love the opportunity to speak more about ABATE and what we do.



Hi everyone,

I hope everyone is gearing up for a very busy riding season. Here are just a few events that Long Island ABATE was set up at this past month of April. On April 6th Long Island ABATE was set up at the Riders of Fire annual bike blessing. Unfortunately, the weather did not cooperate so nicely. It was a bit rainy and very cold out that day, but there were still vendors set up and the DJ was playing great music. There were your die-hard riders that did show up for the run! That's what we love about our motorcycle community. Always out showing support! On April 8th at our membership meeting at the Elks Lodge which is always the second Tuesday of every month we had guest speakers from Suffolk County highway department, which is made up of 20 full and part-time riders. There are normally nine full-time riding officers. Officer Sergeant Brendan Pilkington and Officer Scott Pugan are part of that unit. Every year just before May begins for motorcycle safety and awareness, we have them come in and go over motorcycle crashes in Suffolk County. They went over everything from how our relationship has improved over the years. In years past they used to only do motorcycle only checkpoints and to look for what motorcycles were doing wrong and writing tickets but now their attentions have changed to focus on the safety of motorcyclists. Their goal is as is ours for everyone to get to their destinations and home safe! They spoke about crash statistics which were broken down, of 413 that were reported 19 were fatalities, 321 were injured. The breakdowns were countywide were 65 distracted driving, 62 failure to yield the right of way, 53 were following too closely that's cars and motorcycles, and 35 unsafe actions, 30 lane issues, 23 inexperienced, 23 animal and road conditions. The information they provided was very informative. They even broke down the statistics by day of the week hours of the day and by township, then from township to crashes injured fatalities and hotspots. It was a very informative meeting. We also had Dawn Demilia speak at the meeting that night, she spoke about Rocking the Road for a cure. They care for cancer patients and help them with food, supplies and random needs. She also spoke about raffling off a motorcycle on May 4th at the Boogie for the Boobies at 89 North. Tickets are \$100 and can be purchased online and there will be other prizes to win also. The Rocking the Road for a cure run will be October 4th at post 1066 in Massapequa.

As always on every third Tuesday of the month there is a follow-up meeting in Nassau County at the Marine Corps League in which we go over everything for our Nassau County members that didn't make it out to the Suffolk County meetings.

On Sunday April 13th we were out and about to show support for the Alliance MC pig roast. It was so good to be out and see everyone.

On April 17th we participated with the Long Island Hog chapter and the Elks Lodge for thie blood drive. That was another great turnout. They collected over 35 pints of blood that night which will help save a lot of lives!

On Easter Sunday April 20th was the Rushing Wind biker church sunrise run to Smith's point. Where there were over 100 bikes that participated in that run. Every year it gets bigger and bigger. It was a beautiful morning 67° out and a warm breeze off the water and the sunrise was amazing! The service given by Pastor Ski was great and it was so wonderful to see everyone there. Just think this was only a few of the events that took place in April, and this is only the beginning! I'm so looking forward to everything else coming up in the next few months of riding season!! Till next time please ride safe and enjoy!

H.R. 1566 - The REPAIR Act Right To Equitable And Professional Auto Industry Repair

April 4, 2025

Should you have the choice of where to bring your motorcycle for repairs or to do the work yourself? Should you have access to the parts, tools and service information required to maintain, service and modify your bike? Do you want to control who may access the data from your motorcycle and its use? If you answered yes to these questions, it is time to contact your member of the House of Representatives and ask them to cosponsor H.R. 1566, the "Right to Equitable and Professional Auto Industry Repair Act", known as the "REPAIR Act."

The REPAIR Act ensures that vehicle owners or repair shops can access the information, software or tools needed to work on vehicles. This proposed commonsense law establishes rules regarding vehicle data access and will help preserve consumer choice and a fair marketplace.

A similar bill was introduced during the last session of Congress and cosponsored by 56 Representatives. We need to surpass that number during this session. Help us today!

Support H.R. 2165 - The Choice In Automobile Retail Sales (CARS) Act Of 2025

March 19, 2025

Congress is currently on a one-week recess, but before they left town, Rep. Tim Walberg of Michigan introduced the Choice in Automobile Retail Sales (CARS) Act of 2025. This bill is similar to legislation Mr. Walberg introduced in 2023, which was passed by the U.S. House. The Senate failed to move on that bill, so it died at the end of the 118th Congress. U.S. Representatives Russ Fulcher of Idaho, Gus Bilirakis of Florida and Rick Allen of Georgia have joined Mr. Walberg as lead cosponsors for the 2025 bill.

This bill focuses on protecting the internal combustion engine. It does this in two ways. First, the bill prohibits using authority under the Clean Air Act to issue regulations that mandate the use of any specific technology or would limit the availability of new motor vehicles based on the vehicle's engine type. Second, the legislation requires the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to update any regulations that result in the limited availability of new vehicles based on the engine.

This legislation would overturn a 2024 EPA rule, which, if not revoked, would cause about 56% of new vehicles sold between 2030 and 2032 to require electric motors.

If you want to save the internal combustion engine, ask your Representative to cosponsor H.R. 2165.



What's **Your** Hearing Number?

The Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health recently launched the Hearing Number app, a free tool for testing and tracking hearing that's available for iOS and Android.

What is a Hearing Number?

The Hearing Number is a simple metric to help you understand and monitor your hearing ability over time. It is a clinical measure for hearing loss that tells you the softest speech sound you can hear in decibels. "The Hearing Number gives everyone a way to easily understand and think about their hearing over their lifetimes beginning as a teenager," said Frank Lin, M.D., Ph.D., lead creator of the app. "By knowing their Hearing Numbers, people can understand this important aspect of their health, track the changes to their hearing that occur naturally over time, and know when to use technologies to protect their hearing and hear better." 1

How Do I Get My Hearing Number?

The hearing test through the Hearing Number app is easy to complete – all you need is a pair of headphones or earbuds and five minutes. After you take the hearing test through the app, you'll receive your Hearing Number for each ear.

When you're a child, your Hearing Number can be as low as -10 decibels, but it rises as the years go by and your hearing system begins to deteriorate. The higher your Hearing Number, the poorer your hearing is and the more challenging it can be to hear in loud places.

While the Hearing Number app is a great way to get started on the path to better hearing, don't let your journey end there. Your Hearing Number is not a substitute for a diagnostic audiological evaluation. Take the next step by contacting our team to schedule a complete, state-of-the-art, in-office hearing test. 


