



Dear Secretary Duffy,

The Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) submitted comments to the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) as part of the Trump Administration's executive order regarding efficiency and deregulation. Within the framework of the request, the MRF submitted comments on rules instituted by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) and fuel economy standards.

As you may remember, the attack on the Internal Combustion Engine (ICE) is occurring in three ways. First through emissions regulations issued by the Environmental Protection Agency, second through the power of the California Air Resources Board and finally through increased fuel economy standards issued by NHSTA. Our comments in this submission related only to NHTSA's new fuel standards as that is where the DOT's jurisdiction exists.

We highlighted four concerns the MRF has with the new fuel economy standards which would threaten the Internal Combustion Engine, in an attempt to promote more electric vehicles.

- Reduced availability of affordable support technologies and fuels for motorcycle riders
- Distorted market dynamics and limited consumer choice
- Decreased relevance and impact of the aftermarket parts industry
 Rural motorcyclists will be disproportionately impacted due to insufficient infrastructure
 We also offered three actions the DOT could take.
- Repeal or rollback of the 53.5 mpg target
- Consideration of non-EV pathways to efficiency that respect consumer diversity
- Protections for ICE technology development that support the motorcycling community

These comments are another example of how the MRF is fighting to protect your rights and freedoms in a variety of different ways. No matter where the fight is, the MRF will be there. Stay vigilant.

Congressional Ride To Work Day

June 10, 2025 - Washington, DC

Monday, the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) joined several other members of the Washington, D.C. motorcycling community to celebrate the annual "Ride to Work Day." To kick off the evening, members of Congress rode to the U.S. Capitol to cast votes on several pieces of legislation before joining a larger ride to Mt. Vernon, home of our first president, George Washington.

2025 is the second year the Congressional Motorcycle Caucus has hosted the event, which is growing in popularity! This year, eight members of Congress attended the event, six of whom led the ride. We are most grateful to the United States Park Police, with a Motor Unit established in 1917, for escorting the ride. The MRF thanks Representatives Tim Walberg (MI), Don Bacon (NE), Troy Balderson (OH), Mike Bost (IL), Mike Collins (GA), Warren Davidson (OH), Claudia Tenney (NY) and Derrick Van Orden (WI) for joining the festivities. The MRF joined with representatives from the American Motorcyclist Association, BMW, Buell Motorcycles, Harley-Davidson Motor Company and Indian Motorcycle for this fantastic event. Working with like-minded motorcycle organizations is important for achieving our legislative goals.

In the words of Congressional Motorcycle Caucus Chair Tim Walberg, "Today was a great day!" We at the MRF couldn't agree more. Any day you can get on a motorcycle and ride with others who truly want to make things better for all riders is indeed a great day.

Motorcycle Tax Credits

June 17, 2025 - Washington, DC

Monday, the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) sent letters to leaders in the U.S. Senate supporting motorcycle ownership provisions in the House passed H.R. 1, better known as the "One Big Beautiful Bill." The letters were sent to Majority Leader John Thune of South Dakota and Senate Finance Chairman Mike Crapo of Idaho.

The provisions make interest on loans used to purchase American-made personal vehicles, including motorcycles, tax-deductible. There is concern that this provision may be changed in the Senate, applying the tax deduction only to automobiles. This change would not allow those purchasing new, American-made motorcycles that same benefit. The MRF believes that by making the interest on loans for American-made motorcycles deductible, more money will be put back in the pockets of U.S. middle-class riders while further strengthening U.S. manufacturing, U.S. dealers and after-market repair and mechanic shops, ensuring a solid, safe, and strong motorcycle industry.

Expanding opportunities for Americans to purchase motorcycles is a good thing! The MRF is proud to support the efforts of companies like the Harley-Davidson Motor Company as they seek to grow the community of riders.

CALL TO ACTION! Definition Of A Motorcycle

In the last week of May, Congressman Derrick Van Orden of Wisconsin introduced a bill that directs the Secretary of Transportation to update the nearly 60-year-old federal definition of a motorcycle. In recent years, a new type of vehicle has entered our roadways, commonly referred to as an autocycle. These autocycles are classified as motorcycles at the federal level but have little resemblance to a motorcycle and the operational characteristics are vastly different.

The Motorcycle Riders Foundation believes this ambiguity about autocycles has created an unnecessary patchwork of rules and regulations regarding licensing, insurance, safety statistics, registration and training courses from state-to-state.

Updating the definition of a motorcycle has been on the MRF's legislative agenda for several years. We are grateful that Rep. Van Orden has taken the first step to address this concern. H.R. 3385 will bring the federal definition of a motorcycle into the 21st century.

H. J. Res. 88 Passes On To President

May 22, 2025 - Washington, DC

Today, the U.S. Senate passed by a vote of 51 to 44, H.J. Res 88, a resolution that would overrule the Environmental Protection Agency's rule allowing California to effectively mandate the sale of electric vehicles over the next decade. This plan by California threatens not only the Internal Combustion Engine (ICE) in California but also the entire country, as several other states have tied their rules to those implemented in Sacramento.

You may remember that earlier in the month, the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) put out a call to action urging the U.S. Senate to vote on this resolution as the House of Representatives had passed it in April.

A vote today and two other planned votes on similar Californian proposals are major victories in the defense of ICE. Protecting ICE is a key part of the MRF's 2025 legislative agenda and we are pleased with the actions taken today in the U.S. Senate. This victory, coming the same week as hundreds of bikers met with lawmakers on this same topic, is a sign that we are being seen and heard in Washington, D.C. Thank you to lawmakers for understanding the need to provide consumers a choice in the type of engine they buy and to all the bikers who spoke up in defense of the Internal Combustion Engine.

10 Sounds of Summer That Can Harm Your Hearing

Life just seems easier in summer. Summertime gives us a chance to kick back, relax, and have fun. But the summer also brings a host of noisy activities that could potentially damage our hearing. This seems like a good time to remind our readers of the sounds to watch out for this summer and take steps to protect your hearing so that you can stay safe and enjoy all that the season has to offer.

Sun's Out, Fun's Out and Earplugs Are In

Noise-induced hearing loss (NIHL) is more common than you might think. Repetitive exposure to loud sounds or even a single exposure to a very loud sound can cause hearing loss. Any sound at or above 85 decibels (dB) can cause hearing loss. Here are some of the loud summertime activities that pose a threat to your family's hearing:

- 1) FIREWORKS DISPLAYS —The snap, crackle and pop of fireworks sure look pretty, but they can do a number on your ears. Most fireworks clock in at 125 dB, which is in the danger zone for hearing damage. Use earplugs for adults and young children and earmuffs for babies and toddlers. Even a single blast can do harm!
- 2) AIR SHOWS —Don't just wing it when you go to an air show—bring your hearing protection. The sound of a jet engine is between 120-140 dB, which is extremely harmful to your ears.
- 3) **OUTDOOR CONCERTS**—Because concert noise levels are frequently over 100 dB, you should always rock out with your earplugs in.
- 4) **PARADES**—Children love parades, but the noise levels can harm your child's hearing. Earmuffs are an excellent way to keep your kids' ears safe.
- 5) YARD WORK —Keeping your lawn in shape is practically a full-time job during the summer! Unfortunately, lawn equipment like lawnmowers and hedge trimmers emit sounds between 80-105 dB, so wear your earplugs.
- 6) **CONVERTIBLES**—Taking a spin in a convertible is a treat for the senses—except when it comes to your hearing. The roaring engine and noise from other cars can contribute to tinnitus and other symptoms of hearing damage. You can't use earplugs while driving, but you can minimize your noise exposure by rolling up the windows.
- 7) **TARGET SHOOTING** —Set your sights on protecting your hearing with earplugs and earmuffs while shooting this summer. Nearly all firearms deliver sounds above 140 dB, and small-caliber firearms are above 120 dB.
- 8) **BASEBALL GAMES** —America's favorite summer pastime is nosier than ever, with fireworks, loud announcers and rock music. Remember to score some earplugs before you set foot in the stadium.
- 9) **CAR RACES** —All that vroom-vrooming can be disastrous for your ears—races average between 90-110 dB. Keep your hearing on track by popping in some earplugs.
- 10) MOTORCYCLES AND SPEEDBOATS —Fancy yourself a bit of a James Bond as you fly over open water or whip along a twisty road? Every 007 needs earplugs—they offer protection against the excessively loud engine and wind noise.




