

The inattentive people who drive cars, vans, pickups and trucks are causing more motorcycle accidents than ever before! People are doing more than just driving in their vehicle they are one their cell phone, or doing anything but keeping their eyes on the road! We have to learn to ride defensively to avoid such behavior to avoid having an accident. One

of the ways Long Island ABATE is trying to lessen the chance of accidents is to start early by talking to students in high school driver ed classes about sharing the road with motorcycles. This is accomplished by not only talking to them in class, but by also showing them some very graphic movies and slides of the results of inattentive driving!

Am I Eligible for No-Fault Coverage in The Event of a Motorcycle Crash?

Most motorcycle riders are shocked to learn that New York's No-Fault Insurance Law does not cover motorcyclists. Under Article 51 of the

NY Insurance Law, motorcyclists are specifically not entitled to no-fault benefits in the event of a crash that results in personal injury.

What This Means for Riders:

- No automatic coverage for medical bills or lost wages after an accident.
- Riders must rely on their own health insurance to pay their medical bills.
- Even if the other driver is at fault, that drivers' insurance is NOT responsible for payment of the motorcyclist's medical bills.

The Solution: SUM Coverage

Supplemental Uninsured/Underinsured Motorist (SUM) coverage is essential for motorcyclists. It protects you if:

- The at-fault driver has no insurance.
- The at-fault driver's insurance is insufficient to compensate the motorcyclist for his/her injuries

Why It's Critical:

- Most drivers in NY only have \$25,000 of liability insurance. That will not begin to compensate a motorcyclist who has serious injuries.
- SUM coverage can eliminate that problem by providing compensation for pain and suffering.

If you ride in New York, adding SUM coverage is not an option. It is essential! Here is what you should have, at a minimum:

BODILY INJURY LIABILITY \$ 250,000

PROPERTY DAMAGE \$ 50,000

SUM INSURANCE COVERAGE \$ 250,000







Hearing Well Is Your Key to Connection

It's August, which means it's Hearing Health Awareness Month! While loneliness may seem like no big deal, it can significantly impact your physical and mental health. Research has found that loneliness and isolation are as bad for you as smoking 15 cigarettes a day!² Loneliness can also increase your risk of premature death, dementia and depression.³

Keep in Touch to Keep on Thriving

Maintaining your relationships enhances your overall well-being—and hearing your best is crucial for connecting with others. That's why being proactive by getting regular hearing checkups can help you identify and treat any hearing loss sooner rather than later, which will help strengthen your social ties.

Evidence shows that treating hearing loss with hearing devices can help get you back to being part of the world. In one study of hearing device users, 91% of patients indicated that they were satisfied with the ability of their hearing devices to improve communication in one-on-one situations, and 85% said their hearing devices improved communication in small groups. ⁴

Being able to communicate more easily allowed users to connect more fully with family and friends. More than half of the patients reported that using hearing devices enhanced their relationships at home and allowed for a more fulfilled social life.


