NYS Grant for Motorcycle Safety. Cards handed out about motorcycle safety.

The Sergeant went over statistics that were compiled from October 2023 through December 2024. This is for Suffolk County which includes the east end. Total crashes, 413;

19 motorcyclists were killed and there were 321 injuries.

County wide of the 413 crashes:

65 were distracted driving;

62 failed to yield

53 following to close

35 speeding

30

23 inexperienced drivers

Others were reaction to uninvolved vehicles; improper turns; unsafe lane change; animals and slippery pavement.

Crashes per the days of the week:

Saturday is the largest. Top 3 are Thursday, Friday and Saturday. Safest is Wednesday @ 41; Tuesday @ 48; Monday @ 56; Sunday at 59; Thursday @ 66; Friday @ 70 and Saturday @ 73. Safest time is at night.

Largest amount of crashes is between 4 PM and 7PM.

Motorcycle accidents w/another vehicle

Babylon Township: 55 crashes; 48 injuries and 3 fatalities. Hot Spot: Southern State Parkway; Montauk Highway; Sunrise Highway; Great Neck Road

Town of Huntington: 34 crashes; 24 injuries and 1 fatalities. Hot Spot: Route 110; Jericho Turnpike – East to West.

Town of Islip: 100 crashes; 73 injuries; and 4 fatalities. Hot Spot: Brentwood Road; Suffolk Ave; Route 111 and Sunrise Highway

Town of Smithown: 25 crashes; 1 fatality and 20 injuries. Hot Spot: Sunken Meadow Parkway and Indian Head Road.

Town of Brookhaven: 125 crashes; 101 injuries and 4 fatalities. Hot Spot: Middle Co Road; LIE; Sunrise Highway; Route 25A; Montauk Highway; William Floy Parkway – Shirley area extremely hot and Montauk Highway.
